George L. Stone of Blackfoot, Ida., has been in Atlanta for the past few days looking over his mining interests. Mr. Stone is greatly taken up with the camp and expects to return in the near future to spend the summer.

A fine strike has been made lately in the lower end of the camp by a couple of Italian boys. They have a tunnel in about thirty feet under a lime capping striking a vein about three feet wide showing some free gold. The owners feel very good over this strike. Atlanta people wish their every success. They are among the some of the oldest claim holders in the camp.

C. E. Lacy, who has the contract to sink a 100-foot shaft for the new company, is making fine progress. He has three 8-hour shifts at work and everything is moving along in fine shape. "Good luck to Bill."

Pioche Record:— Will you permit me to correct an article you published under date of June 12?

In speaking of the Atlanta property you speak of it as being located at Silver Park. You have been misinformed as to its location. It is in Atlanta, a gold camp, while Silver Park is an old silver camp; Atlanta is about two and one half miles from Silver Park.

The Jesse Knight property is "The Nevada Park" property and is not in any way related to or connected with the Atlanta property now, nor ever has been.

If you will take the trouble to look up the matter, you will find that these claims were located in October and November, 1907, by myself and Fred Haurand. I grub-staked the group; every dollar ever expended in locating the Atlanta was of my earnings, and I had the honor of naming the group.

I not only located this group, but the Mid, Moat and Tip-Top claims for John Bowen; also the Unlucky claim for Walker Lee and Henry Schlichling; and the Belle for myself. So if you will kindly correct these statements all owners of Atlanta property would be highly pleased, as we do not desire to be quoted as Silver Park people.

The gold was discovered in May of last year, and in July of last year we sold the four "Atlantas" to George an

Belle Latimore, they having done the assessment work last year and bonded it with two other claims of theirs to the parties you mention.
