A GREAT MINERAL STATE.

J. A. Largent, a Rhyolite attorney and mining man, has compiled a lot of statistics showing what Nevada has done in the way of increasing the world's supply of metallic wealth since the opening of the Comstock lode in 1859.

As to the accuracy of Mr. Largent's figures the Pioche Record cannot vouch for, yet we are of the opinion that in most instances cited he has displayed conservatism.

The year 1859 saw the opening of Virginia City, which did not disclose her bonanza until 1873. The output of the Comstock was \$61,500,000. Other camps are rated as follows:

BANK OF PIOCHE GETS JUDGMENT BY DEFAULT.

Judgment was entered in the district court Wednesday in favor of the plaintiff in the case of the Bank of Pioche vs J. A. and W. A. Denton. The bank sued on a promissory note, and judgment, costs and attorney's fees amount to nearly \$600.

GRAND JURY REPORT.

Will Probably Reach Judge Brown Late This Afternoon.

The grand jury, which has been in session for the past ten days, is expected to complete its labors sometime today and its report will probably be placed in the hands of Judge Brown late this afternoon.

The jury has spent considerable time in investigating into the mysterious death of Charles Todd, whose body was taken out of a well near the home of Julius Weir, Sr., at Bristol on the 7th day of last June. The body of Todd was exhumed yesterday for the purpose of determining if the skull of the dead man contained any fractures. The gruesome sight was witnessed by members of the grand jury and a number of others whose morbid curiosity had been aroused. The body was in a bad state of decomposition and as County Physician Duckworth lifted the head from the box the flesh fell from the bones, exhibiting a fracture on the left side of the skull; furnishing more evidence that Todd was murdered and that his body was thrown into the old abandoned well with the view of covering up the crime.

It will be remembered that after Todd's body was discovered, Julius Weir Sr., his wife, Mrs. Kate Weir, and their son, Julius Weir Jr., were placed under arrest upon suspicion of having been responsible for the death of Todd. At the preliminary hearing held before Justice Alfred Perkins, Julius Weir Sr., and Mrs. Kate Weir were discharged, but the young man was bound over to await the action of the grand jury. It is believed that since yesterday's developments at the grave yard, an indictment will be returned against young Weir.

MARITAL BONDS OF THE COWANS SEVERED.

A divorce was granted by Judge Brown yesterday in the case of Ben Cowan vs Elizabeth Cowan. The case had been pending for several years. Cowan instituted proceedings against his wife alleging cruelty. The latter entered across-complaint charging her husband with other things not conducive to happiness. The husband failing to appear the divorce was granted on the cross-complaint.


