SAFETY WHILE TRAVELING.

During the year ended June 30 last the great Chicago & Northwestern railroad system carried 27,000,000 passengers without a single fatality. This is the kind of record that all the high-grade railroad lines are striving for with intelligent persistence. Along with the Northwestern, the Pennsylvania, the Burlington and the Santa Fe systems of late have achieved the distinction of running their trains for an entire year without killing a passenger.

There is no luck about these golden records. They stand as the reward for thorough equipment, representing large investments of money, and also for efficient organization, intelligent discipline and generally reliable service. It has been proven many times that train accidents are the fruits of bad railroading, whether the blunder is reckless or overworked members of a train crew, a muddled train dispatcher or some other person, his presence at the point of danger prepared to work havoc is proof of bad management somewhere.

The railroads which have gone out of the grim business of permitting fatal mistakes in the handling of their trains have splendid management and splendid equipment to make clear that if Providence has favored them at least it has been an assisted Providence.

The flawless record of the Northwestern and other railroads, of course, tell only part of the story of its growing infrequency. Railroad management throughout this country shows great improvement in the matter of protecting the lives of passengers. Accidents of every sort must continue to decrease as the facilities of railroads for doing business are increased and the wicked folly of permitting inefficiency to have a hand in their affairs is more clearly recognized by the responsible officials.
