

LAND TO BE OPENED FOR SETTLEMENT SOON

On the 24th inst., there will be filed in the U. S. land office at Carson City, the official plats of township 1 North, range 55 East. On or after the date mentioned the land office will receive applications for any of the lands, if not reserved, embraced in this township. Persons claiming preference right should file their applications within ninety days after their applications are filed. Applications received within twenty days prior to June 24th, will be received at the land office.

GOODSPRINGS MINE TO PAY DIVIDEND

Goodsprings Gazette: Authentic information comes to the Gazette that at the next directors' meeting, to be held the latter part of the

month, a dividend of 15 cents each share of the capital stock the company will be declared. The dividend will amount to \$150,000 and will bring the total dividend paid thus far this year to \$500,000 or 50 per cent of the total capitalization of the company. The dividend checks will go out about June 15.

HIG WOOL CLIP SOLD FOR A HIGH FIGURE

The Steptoe Land & Livestock Co. and the Ox Yoke Co., of this place, composed of H. A. Agee and associates, have both disposed of their 1915 clips of wool to the B. Harris Wool company of Salt Lake City, the purchaser being Albert Smith, a representative of the company.

The sale was made last Saturday the company giving Mr. Agee a check for a large amount to bind the sale of the wool. This sale represents the fleeces from about twenty thousand head of sheep, and is conservatively estimated at 160,000 pounds, or eight pounds to the sheep, and the price paid was 25 cents per pound. This is the highest price ever paid for a large clip in eastern Nevada, and is only exceeded by one or two recent instances in the western part of the state.

All the sheep in the Pole creek pen have been sheared and the shearers have moved to Cherry Creek and Current, at which places they will finish the season's work on the sheep belonging to the companies above named.—Wells Herald.
