Inter State News

Sheep shearing plants are working overtime in sections of the interior of Oregon.

For the first time in ten years the falling of snow in May was witnessed in Reno on May 23.

A great many of the farmers on the Twin Falls tract in Idaho are shipping in thoroughbred livestock.

Work has begun by citizens of Winnemucca, Nevada, for a celebration of the Fourth of July that will eclipse former efforts.

The weather observer for Smith, Lyon county, Nevada, in a report to the Reno office advises that frosts have ruined the alfalfa crop and nearly all other crops.

James C. Bulger, under sentence to be hanged at Denver for the killing of L. E. Nicodemus, was granted a 30-day reprieve by Governor Carlson to the week beginning June 18.

Susan Netherly, 10-year-old daughter of William Netherly, a rancher near Brandon, Ore., was accidentally shot and killed by a revolver in the hands of her brother, Ozie, aged 12.

The body of Louis Mogens, who was drowned in the Truckee river near Reno, was found in a clump of willows two miles down the river from the point where the boy slipped and fell in.

A fisherman of Reno was arrested last week for fishing in the fish ladder at the Highland ditch dam in violation of the law that makes it an offense to fish within 100 feet of a dam.

Robert Moore was instantly killed at Bannack, Mont., by his wife, who almost severed her husband's head from his body with an axe. The tragedy was the outcome of a domestic quarrel.

After a period of temporary aberration following his arrest on a charge of having violated the Mann act, Joe Trujillo has apparently regained his senses and will be taken back from Denver to Idaho.

James Ralph, vice president and general manager of the Hermiston Light & Power company, was shot and killed at Hermiston, Ore., by James Roth, president of the company, who then shot himself.

A large number of coyotes have been destroyed in Nevada during the past month, including many young. The best average was made by Alta DeLong, who exterminated 20 in 16 days, in the vicinity of Amos.

The death of Frank Chapman removes from Nevada one of its earliest pioneers. He came to Nevada in 1874 and ranched for many years. Then he engaged in teaming and, later, entered into business in Reno.

Hydrophobia introduced into the state of Utah by rabid coyotes from Nevada, which followed Utah sheep home from the winter ranges, is now appearing to an alarming extent among dogs and domestic animals.

Discovering the berry boxes shipped into the state are not measuring up to standards required by the Oregon law, Fred G. Butcher, chief deputy sealer of weights and measures, has directed all district sealers to confiscate such boxes.

Bee keepers around Ontario, Ore., declare that the last frost did not injure the prospects for a bumper supply of honey this season. Although the fruit blossoms were hard hit, the increase of alfalfa fields will insure a big harvest for the honey bee.

Honora Leonard, an aged inmate at the State hospital for mental diseases, was instantly killed at Reno when a dummy waiter used to convey food from the basement to the three floors above, dropped on her head, breaking her neck and crushing the skull.

State Insurance Commissioner John James of Utah has been invited by the insurance department of the state of Washington to act in the official examination of the Northwestern Mutual Fire association of Seattle. The examination will take place during June.

Verna Snyder, 3 years old, was crushed to death beneath a heavy farm leveler which her father, Rudolph Snyder, living near Taylorville, Utah, was driving. The child insisted on riding and in attempting to climb to the seat fell under the implement and was terribly mangled.

The twenty-first general annual conference of the Y. M. and Y. L. M. I. A. of the Mormon church, will be held in Salt Lake June 8, 9, 10 and 11, and it is expected that several hundred delegates from points in Utah, Idaho, Wyoming, Colorado, Arizona, New Mexico and California will be in attendance.

The state fish commission of the state of Washington, in an effort to restore the blueback or sockeye salmon run in the upper Columbia, will hatch great numbers of eggs on the Chinook river, near the mouth of the Columbia. The young fish will be liberated in Lake Wenatchee and left to make their way to the sea. It is expected they will return to the upper Columbia to spawn.

Patrick H. Hart, claiming he is wanted for embezzlement at Springfield, Ill., three years ago, and who has worked at a railroad construction camp near Butte, has surrendered to the sheriff at Butte. He said his conscience hurt him and he was afraid the police were following him night and day.

The experimental leaching plant located at the Mason valley smelter at Thompson, Nevada, has successfully treated ten tons of ore per day for the past month and will soon increase the capacity of twenty tons per day.
