Teachers' Institute.

The Madison county teachers' institute for 1895 will be in session October 21 to 25 in the Virginia City school building. The session will begin at 9 o'clock. The instructors engaged are Prof. F. W. McFarland, C. W. Birchard, J. C. Mahoney and E. A. Steere, superintendent of public instruction. Lectures every evening by Prof. Steere and James Reid of Bozeman and others. Montana school law, article XII, Sec. 1803. When a teachers' institute is appointed to be held for any county, it shall be the duty of the county superintendent to give written or printed notice to each teacher in the public schools of the county, and as far as possible to

all others not engaged in teaching who are holders of teachers' certificates, at least 30 days before the opening of such institute of the time and place of holding it; each teacher receiving such notice engaged in teaching a term of school which includes the time of holding such institute shall close school during such institute and attend the same, and shall be paid by the board of the district regular wages as teacher for the time (not less than four days) he or she attended such institute, as certified by the county superintendent. No teacher failing to attend such institute shall receive any compensations for the time he or she may have taught during the session of the institute. The county superintendent may revoke the certificate of any teacher in his county for inexcusable neglect or refusal after due notice to attend a teachers' institute held for such county.
