

ONLY WANTS ONE TERM

Candidate Bryan's First Act Was to Decline a Second Nomination.

Has No Ambition but to Perform Faithfully the Duties of the Office.

Briefly Addresses an Open Air Meeting in Front of His Hotel.

CHICAGO, July 13.—Mr. Bryan received the announcement of his nomination with all the composure and calmness of a man who had been used to such things during a longer life than his.

"If," said he, "this is true, I want to do that which I have for some time had in contemplation in this emergency."

Only Wants One Term. He then turned to the parlor table and with a lead pencil wrote on a scrap of soft paper supplied by one of his newspaper visitors the following address to the American people:

"In order that I may have no ambition but to discharge faithfully the duties of the office, I desire to announce that if elected president I shall under no circumstances be a candidate for reelection."

Before he could complete this work a number of persons desiring to extend congratulations had arrived, but he excused himself to them until he could finish the message. He then shook hands cordially with all present.

Bryan Made a Speech.

Mr. Bryan made a brief speech from the balcony of the Clifton House, addressing a vast crowd which filled Monroe street from State street to Washburn avenue.

CHICAGO, July 13.—Mr. Bryan was born March 19, 1860, in Salem, Ills. He attended Union College of Law in Chicago and while in attendance there was in the office of Lyman Trumbull.

BLAND IS SATISFIED.

Strongly Endorses Bryan as a Statesman and Silversite.

LEBANON, Mo., July 13.—Within five minutes after the bulletin announcing Bryan's nomination was posted Richard P. Bland was receiving the condoleance of his many friends, with a smile on his lips which denoted genuine relief rather than disappointment.

Suits Kansas Populists.

TOPEKA, Kan., July 13.—John Breidenthal, chairman of the Populist state central committee, is encouraged over the nomination of Bryan. He said: "It suits me exactly. I believe the Populist national convention will endorse the nomination of Bryan."

Proposed Amendment to Section 2, Article IX of the Constitution of the State of Montana.

SECTION 2. (Section 5201 political Code.) Every male citizen of the age of twenty-one years, who shall have been a citizen of the United States for ninety days, an inhabitant of this state one year next preceding an election, and for the last thirty days a resident of the county, and who shall have resided in the precinct in which he may offer to vote such time as may be prescribed by law, shall be entitled to vote in such election in the election district of which he shall at the time be a resident, and not elsewhere, for all officers that now are or hereafter may be elective by the people; provided, that no person convicted of felony shall have the right to vote unless he has been pardoned.
