NEWS FROM WASHINGTON.

Captain M. F. Jamar has been dismissed from the United States Army for indebtedness and falsehood.

Ex-Governor Francis of Missouri has been appointed secretary of the interior, vice Hoke Smith, resigned.

It is said President Cleveland has given Hawaiians the option of annexation, a protectorate or a monarchical government.

According to the report of a special officer, Collector Wise of the port of San Francisco is involved in the scandal of the management of its custom house.

POLITICAL NEWS.

Tom Platt will probably be nominated for governor by the New York Republicans.

Sioux City officials refuse to give up their offices at the behest of the city council.

The Populist national committee have decided not to remove Mr. Watson's name from the ticket.

An Indianapolis judge refused to fine sidewalk political orators and scored police for making arrests.

Patrick Fitzpatrick of Winona has been nominated for congress by the First district Minnesota Democrats.

The members of the present state administration of Texas were renominated by the Democratic state convention.

Senator Jones of Arkansas, chairman of the Democratic national committee, has established headquarters in Chicago.

Congressman S. S. Barney was renominated by acclamation by the Republicans of the Fifth Wisconsin district.

It has been decided to open the Iowa campaign at Des Moines Sept. 3, with Allison, Benjamin Harrison and Robert G. Cousins.

Hon. Bourke Cockran replied to Mr Bryan's acceptance speech, before an audience of 18,000 people, at Madison Square Garden.

Senator Hill has invited Candidate Bryan to lunch with him in Albany. Politicians think this good evidence that Hill intends to support Bryan.

The London Times predicts a sharp money squeeze in New York shortly, the result of peculiar financial conditions now obtaining in America.

The New York gold Democrats have issued a call for a state convention at Syracuse Aug. 31, to choose delegates to the convention of the National Democratic party at Indianapolis.

Mr. Bryan, Democratic candidate for president, has come out with a denial that he has ever at any time or under any circumstances, been in the employ of any mine owners, individually or collectively, directly or indirectly, nor in the employ of, or paid by any bimetallic league association.

FINANCE AND TRADE.

South Dakota Indians have raised a large wheat crop this year.

The Cudahys will invest about \$2,000,000 in a pipe line to rival the Standard Oil company.

The Citizens bank of Centerville, S. D., has assigned, with liabilities of \$6,000 and assets at \$25,000.

Merrill, Ring & Co., extensive lumber dealers at Toledo and Duluth, have asked a conference with creditors.

The big manufacturers of bicycles have formed an association to "promote a good understanding among its members."

The Kelly Nail and Iron works and the Belfont Iron works of Ironton, O., have resumed operations, giving employment to 1,300 men.

It is reported that Baron D'Hannis, commanding a strong force, has taken the offensive against the Mahdists on the Upper Congo.

President Kruger of the Transvaal republic declares that there is no hostile intentions toward England on the part of the republic.

The British bombarded Zanzibar and destroyed the palace, finally compelling Said Khalid, the usurping chieftain, to surrender. Numerous natives were killed.

A dispatch from Madrid says the first embarkation of troops for Cuba will be about Aug. 23, and by Sept. 11 the whole expedition of 40,000 will have left the peninsula.

Albert George Whitehead, one of the Irish conspirators just released from Portland Prison, is said to be mentally unbalanced as a result of severe treatment in prison.

Many Spanish ex-ministers and members of the chamber of deputies have been arrested in Barcelona on the charge of conducting a revolutionary agitation, and attempting to prevent departure of reinforcements for Cuba.

The Bulgarian government has notified Turkey that unless the latter appoints delegates to a frontier commission Bulgaria will order troops to occupy the positions previously occupied by the Turks on territory which Bulgaria claims.
