Dy section 12 of the Ordinance of the city of Wheel ine, in relation to the appointment, powers and duties of Sanitary committees and Board of Health of the city of Wheeling, it is enacted:

"That it shall be uniawful for any person, without mission from the council or Board of Health, or any thromembers thereof. to brine or cause to be brought, or to aid or assist in bringing within this city, any one having the small pox or Asistic cholera or any other disease the introduction of which shall be prohibited by any order of the Board of health, (notice of such order having been given by a publication thereof in any newspaper printed in this city,) unless such person shall use all possible care and dilingence to prevent any communication with the diseased person, except by physicians and relatives, and shall convey him or her as soon as practicable, beyond the limits of the city. Every person offending against the provisions of this section shall forfeit and pay to the city not tess than fifty nor more than sive hundred dollars for every such offence."
