NEWS SUMMARY.

WE begin to bear now from various quarters of the ravages of insects upon the growing wheat. The late heavy rains bave been injurious in many places. The hail storms have otterly destroyed many fields of wheat. Fears are entertained that the late splendid prospect will not be realized at the harvest. The Fredcricksburg Herald says that it hears of no chinch bug about there yet, "but if we have. ne or two more hall-storms, each bug must me with a large knapsack on his back filled with food, or run the risk of starring, as we shall have precions little wheat left for him to harvest."

Ar a recent fire in Boston, a woman appeared at one of the third story windows of the building, frantic and despairing. Thereupon the persons called upon her to take courage and olserve their directions, and they would save her. They then, as many as could join, formed a circle, each man extending his arms horizontally, and grasping with his right hand the right hand, and with his left the left hand of the man opposite, their arms crossing. They then told her to kneel upon the window sill and incline her body in such a way as to free her head from the wall and fall sideways. All being ready, she threw herself from the third story window! Not a man drew back-all stood firm, and the poor woman was received in safety on the platform of human hands and arms arms nerved by noble hearts!

THE damage by the Bell crevasse, says the New Orleans True Delta, of the 17th inst, now and eventual, to the sugar crop alone, is estimated at \$3,000,000 at least! In addition to this lisastrous item, is the destruction of corn, other roduce, stock and fixtures. The floods from thatigrevasse have inundated the country some twentyfive miles down the river, overflowing thirty and forty plantations, and are crawling on down towards the Gulf.

THE canvass of Van Amburgh's Menagerie was blown down at Columbus, Ohio, on Friday night, after the crowd had gathered under its ample canopy. The women screamed, the children cried, the lions roured, the animals made all the noise they could, and there was a general rush to escape out of the show into the wind and rain.
