

NEW VOTING PRECINCTS

CHANGES MADE BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

Fairmont District.

STATE OF WEST VIRGINIA, SS.: At a County Court held in and for Marion county, at the Court-house of said county, on Friday, July 1, 1904— Present: W. E. Cordray, President; Festus Downs and S. E. Fleming, Commissioners, being all the Commissioners of this Court.

It now being more than 90 days before an election is to be held in this county or any district or precinct therein, and it appearing to the Court that public convenience and the public good require that election precincts Nos. 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 in Fairmont district, as heretofore established by this Court, and the boundary lines thereof be rearranged and redivided and re-established into 7 election precincts; and the Court doth therefore order that said precincts Nos. 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 in said Fairmont district, as heretofore established, be hereby abolished and that in lieu thereof the said territory composing the same be and is hereby divided into 7 election precincts as follows, to be known and numbered as follows, respectively, with the following boundary lines, respectively, each of which contains as nearly as practicable the number of electors required and are in all respects as required by law, and none of which contain more than 250 electors, and that voting places be established in each thereof as follows, that is to say:

PRECINCT NO. 1.—Beginning at the foot of Jefferson street at the Monongahela river and running with the center of said street to Spruce street on Hamilton's hill; thence with the center of Spruce street to the corporation line; thence in a straight line to a point in the Barrackville road at the top of the ridge near the Catholic cemetery; thence with said road to the bridge across Coal run near the colored Baptist church; thence with Coal run to the river; thence with the river to the place of beginning. And that the voting place for said precinct No. 1 be and is established at the Court-house in the City of Fairmont.

PRECINCT NO. 2.—Beginning at the foot of Jefferson street at the river and running with the center of said street to Spruce street; thence with the center of Spruce street to the corporation line; thence in a straight line to a point in the public road near the G. W. Adams brick residence, including the said residence; thence with the said public road to the Barnsville road near William Gaskill's residence; and thence with said Barnsville road to Quincy street; thence with Quincy street to the river; and thence up said river to the beginning. And that the voting place for said precinct No. 2 be and is established at the Second ward public school building at Fairmont.

PRECINCT NO. 3.—Beginning at a point in the county road near the said Adams' residence and corner to precincts No. 2 and No. 3, and thence running with the western boundary of precinct No. 3 to the Pawpaw district line; thence with the Pawpaw district line to the Lincoln district line; thence with the Lincoln district line to a point in said line near the residence of Milton Shroyer, so as to leave said Shroyer in precinct No. 3; thence in a straight line to a point in the Farmington pike at the Conaway graveyard on top of the hill; thence with the top of the ridge to a point in the Barrackville road near the Catholic cemetery; and thence with line of precinct No. 1, and precinct No. 2 to the beginning. And that the voting place for said precinct No. 3 be and is established at Barrackville school house.

PRECINCT NO. 4.—Beginning at a point in the county road near the said Adams' residence and corner to precincts No. 2 and No. 3, and thence running with the western boundary of precinct No. 3 to the Pawpaw district line; thence with the Pawpaw district line to the Lincoln district line; thence with the Lincoln district line to a point in said line near the residence of Milton Shroyer, so as to leave said Shroyer in precinct No. 3; thence in a straight line to a point in the Farmington pike at the Conaway graveyard on top of the hill; thence with the top of the ridge to a point in the Barrackville road near the Catholic cemetery; and thence with line of precinct No. 1, and precinct No. 2 to the beginning. And that the voting place for said precinct No. 4 be and is established at Barrackville school house.

PRECINCT NO. 5.—Beginning on Locust avenue at the stone bridge across Coal run and thence up said run to the bridge on the Barrackville road, near the colored Baptist church; thence with said road to the top of the hill near the Catholic cemetery gate, corner to precinct No. 1, thence with the line of precinct No. 1, and following the ridge dividing the waters of Farmington pike at the Conaway graveyard; thence in a straight line to Locust avenue, near the school house; thence across through the Dr. White lands to Bell run; thence with it to Coal run, and thence up Coal run to the beginning. And that the voting place for said precinct No. 5 be and is established at the old Mayor's office, Fifth ward, Fairmont.

PRECINCT NO. 6.—Beginning on the Monongahela river at the mouth of Coal run, at a corner of precinct No. 1, and running thence up said river with its meanders to a point; thence leaving said river and running N. 69 deg. 45 min. W. 762 feet, and running on the line between Joseph M. Fleming's reservation and the lands of Fairmont Development Company's addition to the town of Fairmont to the east side of the alley between Park avenue and Minor avenue (of said addition); thence along the east side of said alley S. 29 deg. 45 min. W. 750 feet, crossing Eighth street to the south side of Ninth street; and thence along the south side of Ninth street N. 60 deg. 15 min. W. to Prospect avenue; thence along the west side of Prospect avenue to Seventh street; and thence along the south side of Seventh street and the same course continued to the line of precinct No. 5, the corporation line of West Fairmont; and thence with the lines of precincts No. 5 and No. 1 to the beginning. And that the voting place for said precinct No. 6 be and is established at the State Normal School building, Fairmont.

PRECINCT NO. 7.—Beginning at a point in the Barnsville road, near William Gaskill's, and corner to precinct No. 3, and thence with line of precinct No. 3, as herein established (including William Gaskill in precinct No. 7), to the Monongahela river; thence up said river to Quincy street; thence with Quincy street to the Barnsville road, on Hamilton's hill; thence with said Barnsville road to the beginning. And that the voting place for said precinct No. 7 be and is established at Hamilton's ware house.

PRECINCT NO. 8.—Beginning on the Monongahela river, at the corner

of precinct No. 5, and running thence up said river to the mouth of West Fork river; thence with said West Fork river to the southeast corner of Lincoln district; thence with the line of Lincoln district to a point near the residence of Milton Shroyer, corner to precinct No. 4, so as to include said Shroyer in precinct No. 8; thence in a straight line and with a line of precinct No. 4 to a point in the Farmington pike near the Conaway graveyard; and thence with the lines of precinct No. 5 and precinct No. 6 to the beginning. And that the voting place for said precinct No. 8 be and is established at the old store room at Hunsaker bridge.

And that the foregoing be and are election precincts Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8, and the voting places therein, respectively. And that precinct No. 3 as heretofore established remain as precinct No. 3 of said district. And that this order and notice of the same be published and posted as required by law.

Lincoln District.

STATE OF WEST VIRGINIA, SS.: At a County Court held in and for Marion county, at the Court-house of said county, on Friday, July 1, 1904— Present: W. E. Cordray, President; Festus Downs and S. E. Fleming, Commissioners, being all the Commissioners of this Court.

It now being more than 90 days before an election is to be held in this county or any district or precinct therein, and it appearing to the Court that public convenience and the public good require that election precincts Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 in Lincoln district, as heretofore established, be hereby abolished, and that in lieu thereof the said territory composing the same be and is hereby divided into 5 election precincts as follows, to be known and numbered as follows, respectively, each of which contains as nearly as practicable the number of electors required and are in all respects as required by law, and none of which contain more than 250 electors, and that voting places be established in each thereof as follows, that is to say:

PRECINCT NO. 1.—Beginning at the Mannington district line near where the road from Gray's run intersects the road from Salltick to Teverbaugh on top of the ridge dividing the waters of Buffalo and Teverbaugh creeks, and following said ridge to the county road in the low gap above the residence of M. E. Parrish, between said Parrish's farm and the Fairmont Coal Company's; thence on a straight line to the residence of the late Robert Jones, not including said Jones' residence in this precinct; thence on a straight line across Helen's run to the intersection of the county road coming in from Davis ridge into the road from Helen's run to Farmington and near the residence of D. N. Snider; thence on a straight line from said point to the Davis ridge M. E. church; and following said county road toward Monongah at the gate of B. F. Holbert; thence following the road around the ridge between Helen's run and Davis ridge to the Fairmont and Clarksburg pike at the intersection of said road at the Buckley farm; thence on a straight line to the West Fork river opposite the Everson mill; and with said river to the Harrison county line at the mouth of Binghamon creek; and with said creek at the intersection of the road leading up Binghamon and the road from Worthington to Shinnston; and thence on a straight line to the old school house on Harter's hill and from said school house to the residence of Peter L. Bassett, so as not to include said Bassett in said precinct No. 1; and following the ridge dividing the waters of Binghamon and Teverbaugh creeks to the Mannington district line at the place of beginning. And that the voting place for said precinct No. 1 be and is established at Worthington school house.

PRECINCT NO. 2.—Beginning at a point in the line of precinct No. 1 of the Binghamon and Worthington county road near the mouth of Binghamon and following the Harrison county line to the Mannington district line; and with said Mannington district line to the line of precinct No. 1 at the intersection of Gray's run, Salltick and Teverbaugh county roads, and with said line of precinct No. 1 to the place of beginning. And that the voting place for said precinct No. 2 be and is established at Robinson's school house near Sturm's mill.

PRECINCT NO. 3.—Beginning at the corner of precinct No. 1 at Davis ridge M. E. church, and running a straight line to the Fairmont district line near the residence of the late Milton Shroyer; and following said Fairmont district line to the West Fork river; and up said river to precinct No. 1 opposite the Everson mill; and with the line of precinct No. 1 to the place of beginning. And that the voting place for said precinct No. 3 be and is established at the school house at West Monongah.

PRECINCT NO. 4.—Beginning at the Fairmont district line at the corner of precinct No. 3; and thence running with the Fairmont district line to the Pawpaw district line; thence with the Pawpaw district line to the top of the hill at the county road leading from Farmington to Bassettville above the residence of the late George Price; thence with the ridge to the top of the hill above Bert Parker's, including said Parker in said precinct No. 4; thence to the top of the ridge above Elijah Atha's on the dividing ridge between Lincoln run and Plum run; and thence with said ridge to the top of the hill above the John Burns house; thence with the dividing ridge between Carbray fork of Plum run and Laurel run to the knob above the residence of C. J. Lough; thence with a straight line to the mouth of East run; and thence to the line in precinct No. 1 at the county road in the

low gap at the top of the hill above M. E. Parrish's; thence following the line of precinct No. 1 to the Fairmont district line, the place of beginning. And that the voting place for said precinct No. 4 be and is established at James Reese's shoe shop at Farmington.

PRECINCT NO. 5.—Beginning at the corner of precincts No. 1 and No. 2 at the Mannington district line in intersection of Gray's run, Teverbaugh and Salltick county roads, and with said Mannington district line to the corner of precinct No. 4; and with the line of precinct No. 4 to the line of precinct No. 1 at the low gap above M. E. Parrish's; and with said line to the place of beginning. And that the voting place for said precinct No. 5 be and is established at the lower Plum run school house.

And that the foregoing be and are the election precincts of said Lincoln district, and the voting places therein, respectively. And that this order and notice of the same be published and posted as required by law.

Mannington District.

STATE OF WEST VIRGINIA, SS.: At a County Court held in and for Marion county, at the Court-house of said county, on Friday, July 1, 1904— Present: W. E. Cordray, President; Festus Downs and S. E. Fleming, Commissioners, being all the Commissioners of this Court.

It now being more than 90 days before an election is to be held in this county or any district or precinct therein, and it appearing to the Court that public convenience and the public good require that election precincts Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 in Mannington district, as heretofore established, be hereby abolished, and that in lieu thereof the said territory composing said precincts Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 in said Mannington district as they now exist be and are hereby abolished, and that in lieu thereof the said territory comprising said precincts Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 be and is hereby divided into 5 election precincts as follows, with the following boundary lines, respectively, each of which contains as nearly as practicable the number of electors required and are in all other respects as required by law, and none of which contain more than 250 electors, and that voting places be established in each thereof as follows, that is to say:

PRECINCT NO. 1.—Beginning at the county bridge across Buffalo creek at Burt's tannery; thence up said creek to the forks at Mannington; thence up the Maryland and Ohio river turnpike to Joe's run road; thence up the ridge to the head of Dent's run and Price's run and along the ridge to the head of Price's run; thence along the ridge between Dent's run and Bartholomew fork to John Hays' red barn on ridge between Dent's run and Bartholomew fork; thence along the ridge between Bartholomew fork and Dent's run to forks of road above John Baker III, between Pyles' fork and Dent's run; thence along the ridge between Pyles' fork and Dent's run to the head of Dent's run; thence to the head of Drake's run; thence between Drake's run and Clear drain to the mouth of Brushy run at John Shanks'; thence down Pyles' fork creek to the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad bridge; thence down the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad tracts to Main street in the Town of Mannington at Elizabeth Crim's; thence with Main street and its extension to a point in the pike at the old pond; thence a straight line to Buffalo creek; thence down said creek to the beginning. And the voting place for said precinct No. 1 be and is established at the Motter building at Mannington.

PRECINCT NO. 2.—Beginning near the Shafer school house at the head of Whetstone run; thence with the ridge and line of precinct No. 3 to the Wetzel county line; thence with the said Wetzel county line to the point where the road crosses the line above Frank Cunningham's farm; thence down the road leading to Mannington to a point in the pike near George W. Beaty's; thence up the point and along the ridge between Bartholomew fork and the waters on the east to the head of Price's run; thence along the ridge between Dent's run and Rice's run to a point near the Summer's line; thence down the point to the Joe's run road; thence with the line of precinct No. 2 to the beginning. And the voting place for said precinct No. 2 be and is established at the school house at Logansport.

PRECINCT NO. 3.—Beginning at the Maryland and Ohio river turnpike at George W. Beaty's and with line of precinct No. 4 up the point and along the ridge with the line of precinct No. 4 to the head of Price's run; thence with the ridge between Dent's run and Bartholomew fork to Hays' red barn on the ridge between Dent's run and Bartholomew fork; thence a straight line across Murray fork of Bartholomew fork so as to cross below Jacob L. Murray's dwelling house to the point between Murray and Thomas Campbell; thence along the ridge to the Wetzel county line at a point where Jacob L. Murray and Mary J. Hamilton corner; thence with the Wetzel county line to Brink; thence along the same county line to where the road leading up past W. N. Cunningham's crosses the ridge and a corner to precinct No. 4; thence with a line of precinct No. 4 to the beginning, at the pike near Beaty's. And that the voting place for the said precinct No. 3 be and is established at the school house at or near Rymer.

PRECINCT NO. 4.—Beginning at Wetzel county line at a corner of precinct No. 5; thence with the Monongalia county line and with the Monongalia county line to the head of Messer's run; thence along the ridge between Messer's run and Campbell's run to the county road at Brumage's; thence with the county road to the mouth of the run; thence across the hill to the State fork road so as to include H. C. Ferrell; thence up the point so as to include Morgan Rice to the top of the hill to precinct No. 1; thence to the ridge between Dent's run and Hays' red barn at head of Dent's run; thence with line of precinct No. 5 to the Wetzel county line, the place of beginning. And that the voting place for said precinct No. 4 be and is established at the

W. R. Sellers building at Glover's Gap.

PRECINCT NO. 7.—Beginning at the Lincoln district line at the top of ridge between the waters of Mod's run and Llewellyn run; thence along the ridge to a point between the head of Brushy run and Mohon's run; thence along the ridge between Brushy run and Llewellyn run; thence along the ridge between Brushy run and Flat run and down the point to the mouth of Brushy run near John Shanks'; thence with line of precinct No. 1 to the head of Drake's run; thence with line of precinct No. 1 to a point on the ridge between Pyles' fork and Dent's run to a point above Morgan Rice's where it strikes a line of precinct No. 6; thence with a line of precinct No. 6 to the Monongalia county line at the head of Messer's run and with the Monongalia county line to the Pawpaw district line at Highland church, and with Pawpaw district line until it strikes Lincoln district line to the place of beginning. And that the voting place for precinct No. 7 be and is established at the Army at Flat run.

PRECINCT NO. 8.—Beginning at the county bridge across the creek at Burt's tannery and running thence with the lines of precinct No. 1 to the mouth of Brushy run at John Shanks'; thence with the lines of precinct No. 7 to the Lincoln district line; thence with the Lincoln district line to the Harrison county line, to the line of precinct No. 3; thence with the lines of precinct No. 3 and precinct No. 2 to the beginning. And that the voting place for said precinct No. 8 be and is established at Burt's school house near Burt's tannery.

And that the foregoing be and are election precincts Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 in said Mannington district, and the voting places therein, respectively. It is further ordered that precincts Nos. 2 and 3 in said district as heretofore established, and as they now exist, remain as precincts of said district numbered 2 and 3, respectively. And that this order and notice of the same be published and posted as required by law.

Union District.

STATE OF WEST VIRGINIA, SS.: At a County Court held in and for Marion county, at the Court-house of said county, on Friday, July 1, 1904— Present: W. E. Cordray, President; Festus Downs and S. E. Fleming, Commissioners, being all the Commissioners of this Court.

It now being more than 90 days before an election is to be held in this county or any district or precinct therein, and it appearing to the Court that public convenience and the public good require that an additional election precinct be laid off and established in Union Magisterial district of this county, and that in order to lay off and establish the same it is necessary that the boundaries of the 4 election precincts in said district be divided and established into 5 election precincts; and the Court doth, therefore, order that the 4 election precincts in said Union district as they now exist be and are hereby abolished, and that in lieu thereof the said district be and is hereby divided into 5 election precincts as follows, with the following boundary lines, respectively, and numbered as follows, respectively, each of which contains as nearly as practicable the number of electors required and are in all respects as required by law, and none of which contain more than 250 electors, and that voting places be established in each thereof as follows, that is to say:

PRECINCT NO. 1.—Beginning at the center of end of the suspension bridge at the Monongahela river and running thence to Water street; thence with the center of Water street to Adams or Market street; thence with the center of said Adams or Market street to Columbia street; thence with the center of Columbia street to the center of the Bridgeport and Morgantown pike; thence with the center of said pike to the cross roads at or near residence of Nelson Hull and so as to include said Hull's residence; thence to the Valley river at J. B. Miller's corner, in Shoemaker hollow; thence down and with said river to the beginning. And that the voting place for said precinct No. 1 be and is established at the First ward school house in the City of Fairmont.

PRECINCT NO. 2.—Beginning at the center of the end of the suspension bridge at the Monongahela river, and thence down said river to the Winfield district line; thence with said district line to the point where said line crosses the county road known as the Hopewell road; thence with the center of said road to the road leading from Fairmont to Colfax; thence with the center of the road that leads past Zimri Harr's residence to ridge road leading back toward Palatine; thence a straight line to center of cross roads at or near residence of Nelson Hull; thence with lines of precinct No. 1 to place of beginning. And that the voting place for said precinct No. 2 be and is established at the old Mayor's office, First ward, at Fairmont.

PRECINCT NO. 3.—Beginning at but not including the residence of Enos L. Satterfield above Colfax on the Valley river and running thence a straight line to the county road on the top of the hill near William Thompson's; thence with the top of the ridge to the county road between residence of W. E. Morgan and William Hall; thence with the center of said road to where the headwaters of Grassy run crosses the same near residence of William Hall; thence with said Grassy run to the Bethel M. E. church; thence a straight line to the district line on Prickett's creek at Enoch Vincent's saw mill; thence with said district line to the beginning. And that the voting place for said precinct No. 3 be and is established at Nuzum's Mills school house.

PRECINCT NO. 4.—Beginning at and including residence of Enos L. Satterfield above Colfax, on the Valley river, and running thence with lines of precinct No. 3 to Enoch Vincent's saw mill on Prickett's creek; thence down said creek and with the district line to the point where the district line crosses the county road known as the Hopewell road; thence with the center of said road to the road leading from Fairmont to Colfax; thence with the center of the

road that leads past Zimri Harr's residence to ridge road leading back toward Palatine; thence a straight line to center of cross roads at or near residence of Nelson Hull; thence with the center of the Mundell ferry road to the Valley river near the residence of George Louden; thence up said river to the beginning. And that the voting place for said precinct No. 4 be and is established at Swearingen's school house.

PRECINCT NO. 5.—Beginning at J. B. Miller's corner in Shoemaker hollow at Valley river; thence a straight line to center of cross roads near Nelson Hull's residence (but not including the same); thence with the center of the Mundell ferry road to the Valley river near residence of George Louden; thence down said river to the beginning. And that the voting place for said precinct No. 5 be and is established at Benton's Ferry school house.

And that the foregoing be and are the election precincts of said Union district and the voting places therein, respectively. And that this order and notice of the same be published and posted as required by law.


