Work Outlined By Y.M.C.A. Committee

PHYSICAL ACTIVITIES DISCUSSED AT MEETING HELD YESTERDAY.

The physical department committee of the Young Men's Christian Association held their first regular business meeting yesterday in the Chamber of Commerce rooms. The committee for the ensuing year consists of J. O. Watson, chairman; R. Toothman, secretary; Dr. Fred Hess, D. Maurer, F. Amos, Ward Lanham, W. D. Stockley and O. A. Watson. Those present yesterday were: General Secretary F. W. Rapp, Physical Director W. S. Slater, J. O. Watson, R. Toothman, D. Maurer and F. Amos. A tentative policy for the department was outlined by Physical Director Slater. Some new features were presented and met with the hearty approval of the committee.

A unique system of recording the attendance of the members has been worked out and will be inaugurated immediately. An office has been erected in the basement and an attendant will be in charge, at all times, to assist in the new system and to favor the members in their every desire in this particular department. This system should prove a strong factor in establishing a closer relationship between the association and the member.

It was decided to operate two cross country runs on Thanksgiving morning. The first run will be closed, and only include members of the association that are in the student and employed boys' division. The second run will include only senior members of the association. The details for the events will be worked out soon.

The basket ball situation at the association is in a very unsettled condition. The question of a representative was discussed but nothing definite was decided. The possibilities of a church basketball league was presented by the physical director and the committee warned up to the proposition in an encouraging manner. They decided that the association should place itself in a position to foster and take the lead in the conduct of such a league as just mentioned.

The physical department which has been closed for the past ten days and which has been thoroughly renovated will in all probability be ready for tomorrow. The Grafton High school football team will make the association their headquarters while in the city.

Shaw Wins In Condemnation Proceedings

THIRD SUIT IS SETTLED WITHOUT THE AID OF COURT MACHINERY.

MADE A GAIN OF \$3,550 BY HAVING A JURY DECIDE DAMAGES.

The third of the condemnation damage suits of the Fairmont, Pittsburgh and Morgantown Railroad Company (B. & O.) vs. Harry Shaw, which is to award Mr. Shaw damages for the parcel of land condemned, known as the Jenkins tract, will not go to trial as the case has been compromised outside of the court room.

The commissioners which heard the testimony several months ago and from whose decision an appeal was taken, awarded Mr. Shaw \$7000 for his tract and it is said by the terms of the compromise that he will receive for this lot \$7,250, or \$250 above the amount as fixed by the commission.

This is the third and last of the cases and the total amount awarded Mr. Shaw for the three tracts is \$25,550, or \$2,550 more than the price the railroad was to pay as fixed by the commission.


