No Mexican Cattle?

Col. D. R. Fant of Georgetown, came in Friday from his Santa Rosa ranch and spent a few days en route to Georgetown. The colonel will make a trip shortly to the Territory and Northern markets, and will perhaps be among the heaviest shippers from the Territory this year. Notwithstanding the fact that his aridupois is a little inconvenient in mid-summer, there are few cowmen who get over more territory than he, when necessity arises. Some of the colonel's friends have accused him of being strictly in favor of the Dingley, but give as a reason why he was not at Washington lobbying was from the fact that he was moving heaven and earth to get his Mexican cattle across the Rio Grande before the bill became a law. Col. Fant pleads guilty as far as the protection of our cattle interests are concerned, but denounces the latter as a fabrication pure and simple. The Journal knows whereof it speaks when it says that it is doubtful if the colonel would know a Mexican steer if he should meet it in the road. It is in order now for his friends to come out with an apology and purge themselves of slander.—Stock and Farm Journal.

Civil Service Examination.

The United States Civil Service Commission has ordered that an examination be held by its local board in this city on Saturday, Oct. 2nd, 1897, commencing at 9 o'clock a. m. for all grades in this district in the custom's service. Only citizens of the United States can be examined. The age limitations for this examination are as follows: Minimum 20 years no limit as to maximum age. No application will be accepted for this examination unless filed with the undersigned, on the proper blank, before the hour of closing business on Monday September 13th 1897. Applications should be filed promptly in order that time may remain for correction if necessary.

The commission takes this opportunity of stating that the examinations are open to all reputable citizens of the United States who may desire to enter the service, without regard to race or to their political or religious affiliations. All such citizens are invited to apply. They shall be examined, graded, and certified with entire impartiality, and wholly without regard to any consideration save their efficiency, as shown by the grades they obtain in the examination.

JELLIED CHICKEN.

Singe and draw a good-sized chicken, put it into a kettle of boiling water, boil rapidly for five minutes, then push the kettle to the back part of the stove where it cannot possibly boil again, and allow it to remain until the chicken is tender. When done, lift and put aside to cool, saving the liquor in which it was boiled. When the chicken is cold remove the meat, rejecting the skin and bones. Crack the bones fine, put them, with the skin, and one small, chopped onion, two bay leaves, a blade of mace, and half a teaspoonful of celery seed, into a saucepan. Add one quart of the liquor in which the chicken was boiled. Simmer until reduced to one pint; strain and season. Moisten a perfectly square mould or pan with cold water. Arrange a layer of chicken nearly in the bottom of the mould, then one of slices of hard-boiled eggs, sprinkle lightly with salt and pepper, and a little chopped parsley, then add another layer of chicken, and so on until the ingredients are all placed. Strain over the chicken stock, and stand aside over night to harden. This may be served plain or with mayonnaise dressing.—Mrs. Rorer in Ladies' Home Journal.


