HIDALGO COUNTY DEMOCRATS

Renominate Same Officers—Big Vote Assured—Banquet for Chairman Wells.

Hidalgo, Texas, Oct. 21.—The county democratic convention of Hidalgo county was held here today, according to the call issued by Chairman John Clossner. There were fifty-four delegates present. Wm. Schupior was made temporary chairman of the convention and R. A. Marsh secretary. Resolutions were adopted endorsing the present administration of the county affairs and the same officers were all renominated. The county democracy has no organized opposition this year and a big democratic vote can be relied upon.

The convention adopted a resolution congratulating the state democracy upon the appointment of Hon. Jas. B. Wells as state chairman. Following is the text of the resolution:

"Resolved:—That the democracy of Hidalgo and other Lower Rio Grande counties extend a greeting to their democratic brethren in all parts of the great state of Texas, and congratulate them upon their selection of our old chief—the Democratic War Horse of the Lower Rio Grande—for chairman of the state democratic central committee. Our section of the state has been honored by it, and one of the most responsible positions in a political campaign has been placed in the hands of one of the most loyal and able democrats in the state. His name is James B. Wells, and he lives in Brownsville."

Gen. Weyler, former captain general of Cuba, has been appointed captain general of Madrid.

The British reserve warships at Portsmouth have been provisioned and made ready to sail at a moment's notice.

Dispatches from London say the situation in Ireland is likely to give the British trouble in the near future. Prominent Irish nationalists have prepared an address to President Kruger, expressing sympathy for the fallen Boers, referring to England as the "oppressor" and to the war as "wicked and dishonorable."

Charles Dudley Warner, the well known author, died suddenly Oct. 20 at Hartford, Conn.

The jury in the case of Henry Youtsey returned a verdict of guilty and assessed punishment at life imprisonment.
