A big grading contract has been let by the Southern Pacific at El Paso.

E. H. Britton, a New Orleans traveling man, won a suit damages in the sum of \$7000 against the Dallas Fair association for injuries sustained in a collapse of high seats at the fair.

The Texas league of baseball clubs was perfected at Dallas Sunday.

W. T. Stillwell and Joe Atkins, two prominent cattlemen, were killed in the wreck of a cattle train near Fort Worth.

A man entered a cock fighting pit near Laredo to separate the cocks. One of the roosters attacked him and gaffed him in the leg. He nearly bled to death before medical assistance arrived. Spectators applauded the rooster.

U. S. Vice Consul Arrested at Monterey.

Laredo Times. Dr. Philip Carroll, United States Vice Consul at Monterey and well known here in Laredo, was arrested at Monterey upon his arrival there last Saturday as a result of the declaration made sometime ago by Antonio Gonzalez, his Mexican cook, charging him with assault.

The Doctor was taken to the penitentiary where he remained about two hours. At the end of that time he was released by Governor Leal upon representations made by Consul General Hanna.

The facts of the case are briefly as follows:

Antonio Gonzalez, who made the accusation of assault while occupying a cot in the Monterey hospital, had been in the employ of Dr. Carroll for the past two years as cook. Two days after his employer left this city for the States to meet Mrs. Carroll, he presented himself at the United States consulate in Monterey with a badly damaged face and head, and stated that he had been assaulted by a policeman. His injuries appeared to bear out this statement as they were such as might have been inflicted by a policeman's club. He was sent to the hospital by Consul General Hanna.

It was several days after his entrance that he sent for an attorney and made a sensational declaration accusing the United States Vice Consul with having inflicted the injuries.

An emphatic denial of the truthfulness of the declaration was made at the time by Consul General Hanna. A more emphatic denial was entered by Dr. Carroll on his return from the States. Yesterday Gonzalez entered a similar denial himself.

It is said that the case will go to trial, and that this will be held within the next few days.

An explosion of dynamite in New York damaged several buildings and killed six persons.

All parties owing any Taxes to this, the City of Brownsville, are now hereby notified that, unless all such Taxes are fully paid, to the City Tax Collector, on or before the Tenth (10,) day of February, A. D., 1902, the payment of all such Delinquent City Taxes, and all interest thereon since the date when each year's such Taxes were due, respectively, and the full penalty due thereon, will be rigidly enforced by suit brought therefor, and also by the seizure and sale of the personal, or real property, of all such Delinquents, to fully satisfy all such Taxes, interest, penalty and costs of suit. And that, after any such said suit is instituted, or levy upon property made, all such Delinquent Taxes, interest thereon to date, penalty and costs, can only be paid in current money; That, until the said date of February Tenth, (10th,) A. D., 1902, all such Delinquent Taxes can be paid and will be received, without such interest charge, in current money and City Warrants, or "Scrip," in the same proportions that such Delinquent Tax could have been paid at the time it became due; and thus a large amount be saved to all such Delinquents as pay before such date of the commencement of such legal proceedings.
