M., of that day, at the Court House, in the City of Brownsville, in said County, receive PROPOSALS from any Banking Corporation, Association, or individual Banker, stating the rate of interest that said Banking Corporation, Association or individual Banker offers to pay on the Funds of said County of Cameron, for the term of two years, from and after the said 11th day of February, 1907, up to and until the February Term, A.
