THE inhabitant has nothing so wonderful to tell about weather experiences as those who have witnessed the antics of the weather god throughout the past month, especially with snow in New York on June 2nd.

CLOSE on the discovery that defective steel rails were the cause of most of the railroad disasters which have occurred with such distressing frequency of late, comes news that Harriman has turned down the Bessemer steel rails of the Birmingham factories and given a big order for rails to a Tennessee factory. The Bessemer process was hailed at first as a great advance in the manufacture of steel rails, but it seems now to have been a hideous, ghastly mistake, which has been paid for with hundreds of lives, and countless groans of human agony. It has been a costly lesson to Americans, and in all probability will be a costly one to the steel men as well as to the railroads before it is finally rectified. And the worst of it is that the end is not yet in sight, for the many thousands of miles of track that have been laid with these same defective rails are still there, a menace to American travelers all over the continent.

CITY COUNCIL MEETING.

Plans for Improving City Hall Adopted. Slaughter Pen to Be Moved.

The principal business of the city council meeting yesterday afternoon was the consideration of plans for the proposed improvement and enlargement of the market building and city hall, which occupies the upper floor of the market. Plans were submitted by Contractors M. Hanson and A. Goldammer, and, after considerable discussion, Mr. Hanson's plans were adopted. It was then decided to secure specifications for the work according to these plans.

It was decided to move the slaughter pens from their present location to a site somewhere below town, located on the river, and a committee was appointed to see about securing the necessary ground. As soon as the site is secured, the new slaughter house will be erected on a much more sanitary plan than at present.

IMMIGRATION RECORDS.

Number of Immigrants Admitted and Those Rejected During Month of May.

From Inspector in Charge F. E. Lawton of the immigration service for this district, it is learned that during the month of May there were 86 applications by aliens for admission through this port. Of this number 60 were Mexicans, two Cubans, and 24 aliens of the taxable class, that is, subject to the head-tax of \$2 each, the latter being chiefly Greeks and Syrians.

Of these applicants 47 Mexicans were admitted and 13 rejected, and 17 of the taxable aliens were admitted. The rejections were based on various grounds, a number being refused admission on account of being immoral, and others being

diseased or liable to become public charges.
