HAS LEFT TRINIDAD ATLANTIC FLEET NOW ON ITS WAY TO RIO JANEIRO.

Leaves Trinidad at Easy Pace of Ten Knots an Hour—Governor of Trinidad Gave Many Functions in Honor of Admiral Evans and His Officers While There.

Port of Spain, Trinidad, Jan. 1.—The American battleship fleet weighed anchor at 4 o'clock Tuesday afternoon and steamed for Rio Janeiro. Accompanying the fleet were the supply ships Culgoa and Glacier. Early in the morning the signal went up from Rear Admiral Evans' flagship, the Connecticut, to prepare for departure at 8 a. m., but owing to the delay in the coaling of the battleship Maine from the collier Fortuna, it was necessary to change the time of sailing.

Long before the hour set a myriad of small craft, chiefly launches and steam yachts, moved up and down along the lines of anchored warships, the merry parties aboard shouting farewell to the departing vessels. Thousands of residents climbed the surrounding hills to view the great ships as they moved outward on their journey of 3000 miles and more, while boatloads of excursionists went to the small islands in the gulf and others to the floating dock to catch the last glimpse of the ships that were so royally welcomed to this port almost a week ago.

The fleet presented a magnificent appearance as it steamed out in four columns, with the supply ships trailing, a distance of 400 yards separating one division from another. With the Connecticut in the lead, the battleships headed for the Boas and steamed majestically through the Grand Boas and thence along the northern coast of Trinidad. An average of 10 to 11 knots an hour will carry the fleet to the end of the second lap of the 14,000-mile journey in about 12 days, and it was announced by Admiral Evans before his departure that he expects to reach Rio Janeiro January 10.

During the week of their visit here the American officers and men received every courtesy at the hands of the residents. Sir Henry Moore Jackson, the governor of Trinidad, Colonel Swan and other high officials, gave dinners and garden parties in honor of the commander of the fleet and his officers, and there were scores of excursions and entertainments for the men, all of whom enjoyed more than the ordinary amount of shore leave. The newspapers here and the residents are unsparing in their praise of the exemplary behavior of the men, and the papers compliment Admiral Evans in the warmest terms, expressing to him and his men the best wishes of the people of Trinidad and the hope that they will soon return.

LARGEST WHEAT SHIPMENTS

Portland Breaks Record for Six Months, 1907.
Portland, Ore., Jan. 1.—The first six months of the cereal year of 1907 have witnessed the export of 7,721,570 bushels of wheat and four reduced to wheat, valued at \$2,780,299, against 5,152,983 bushels, valued at \$3,798,387, for the same period last year. It is expected that the shipments of wheat and four reduced to wheat will total nearly 8,225,000 bushels for the first six months of the cereal year. The shipments of foodstuffs this year have been by far the heaviest in the history of the port.

KILLS LOVER OF MOTHER.

Lad Shoots Alleged Lothario—He Surrenders.
Danville, Va., Dec. 31.—Haywood Garland, a man of 42, was shot and instantly killed by Richard Ferrell, 18 years old, in the room of the boy's mother here.
Young Ferrell invokes a new "unwritten law," justifying the murder solely on the ground that Garland was despoiling his home.

Employment Bureau for Road.

Omaha, Neb., Jan. 2.—The Burlington, on January 1, established an employment bureau, through which all skilled labor will be employed. It will be under the immediate supervision of J. N. Redfern, now head of the Burlington intelligence bureau. A complete record will be kept of every person employed.

SPORTING NOTES.

It is stated in Yale graduate circles that "Tad" Jones, this year's quarterback, will be head coach of the Yale football team next year.

Governor Mead has sent a telegram to Professor O. L. Waller, acting president of the Washington State college, congratulating the school and the football team on the victory over St. Louis. Governor Mead declares the victory is a great one for both the college and the state of Washington.

One of the principal matters considered at the recent meeting of the board of control of the Montana State Interscholastic Athletic association was the protest which had been filed by the Spokane high school against the eligibility of two players of this season's football team of Butte high school. The protest aimed to disqualify the Butte team and take from it the state championship for the season of 1907, but the members of the board did not sustain the protest against either man and unanimously gave Butte the interscholastic football championship of Montana.

"Batting" Nelson and Kid Scaler, the latter a boxer of the northwest, had little difficulty in agreeing upon terms at their meeting for a contest in the ring next month. They decided everything except as to the club which shall handle the fight and the man who shall act as referee. It was agreed that the weight shall be 132 pounds at 7 p. m. on the day of the fight. The purse will be divided, 75 per cent to the winner, 25 per cent to the loser.

GENERAL NEWS ITEMS.

Col. Marshal Murdock, editor of the Wichita, Kan., Daily Eagle, is very ill. Edward Hutchinson, a Baltimore & Ohio operator at Welcome, W. V., is believed to have been murdered and his body burned in the station. No trace of the great amount of money or tickets can be found.

No woman, outside the immediate family of the defendant, will be permitted to hear the proceedings of the new Taaw trial.

It is said Secretary Taft brought this message to the president from the m. k. d. "We want peace with the United States and nothing but peace, now and always."

Clarence Darrow, the Chicago attorney has arrived in Los Angeles, where an examination of his physical condition was made, it was found that an operation was unnecessary.

The Morgan and Rockefeller interests are said to have superseded the Guggenheims in control of the big smelter trust and the management of the extensive copper mining interests in which the Guggenheims have wielded a dominant influence for years, states a Seattle report.

Judge Lewis of the federal court at Denver, Col., has quashed all indictment and sustained all the demurrers in coal land fraud cases, thereby releasing about 50 prominent defendants from prosecution. Recently he quashed the indictments of alleged timber frauds, and now this action brings to naught the work of the special grand jury convened in May last.

The government attorneys gave notice that they will take the case to the United States court of appeals.

MINES IN MANY CAMPS.

There is a feeling of optimism in the Coeur d'Alenes, because of the uplift in the price of lead. On December 18, lead reached the quotation \$3.35@3.46, and there it stopped. For several days it remained firm at that figure and then the reaction set in and step by step it has advanced since then till \$3.50@3.60 was reached the latter part of the week, where it again stood till the week ended.

The directors of the Tonopah Mining company of Philadelphia, whose property is located at Tonopah, Nev., passed the dividend on the stock of the company at its meeting recently. The par value of the stock is \$1 a share and recent dividends have been at the rate of 25 cents quarterly. The stock sold as high as \$21 a share, but has been steadily declining, the low point in recent years being reached recently, when the stock sold at \$4.75.

The Hecla mine, at Burke, Idaho, has closed down.

The mines of the Silver King Coalition and Daly West companies at Park City, Utah, will close on January 12. This action will be taken by the directors because of the unremunerative price of lead and silver. One thousand men will be directly affected.

The directors of the United States Smelting, Refining & Mining company declared a quarterly dividend recently on the common stock of one per cent and one and three-quarters per cent on the preferred. The dividend on the common stock three months ago was one and three-quarters per cent.

Work has been resumed at the Granby mines in Boundary, B. C. Shipments of ore will hardly be started before New Year's day, but as the smelter has a large supply of coke on hand, the shipments will be increased as fast as the battery of eight blast furnaces can be placed in commission. Meantime the railways are again getting preparations made for handling the 3000 tons and more per day from the Granby, recalling the crews, etc.

FIVE DIE IN MICHIGAN WRECK

Express Train and Double-Header Freight Collide Head On.

Detroit, Mich., Jan. 1.—Through a dense fog at 40 miles an hour Grand Trunk passenger train No. 5, which left Port Huron for this city, collided head on with a double-header freight train a half mile north of Lenox, Mich. Five trainmen met death, four being killed instantly, the fifth dying three hours later. All of the passengers escaped injury except a baby, who was only slightly hurt. The dead: James Bennett, passenger engineer, Detroit; George Bughner, freight fireman, Detroit; Willard G. Tyler, freight switchman, Detroit; Albert McCall, passenger fireman, Port Huron, Mich.
