

ORDINANCE NO. 73.
Be it ordained by the Council of the Town of Newport as follows:
"An Ordinance granting the right to construct, establish, equip and maintain a telephone and telegraph system within the town limits of the Town of Newport."

Section 1. That R. S. Anderson be and is hereby granted the right, privileges and franchise to erect poles, with the necessary supports, cross-arms and fixtures, and string wires and cables thereon, and to lay, place and stretch wires and cables therein, along, over, upon, under and across the streets, alleys, avenues and public places of the Town of Newport for the transmission of sounds, signals, conversation and intelligence through and over said wires and cables by means of electricity, and to construct, establish, equip and install, maintain and operate a telephone and telegraph system, and to conduct a general telephone and telegraph business within the Town of Newport.

Sec. 2. All necessary connections to subscribers' stations and to other points may be made from such poles with such means, apparatus, poles, wires and appliances as may be requisite. Said grantee shall, if required by the council, file with the board of public works a plan of all conduits, manholes, distributing poles and all other constructions proposed within the limits of the streets, alleys, highways and public places of the said town, in such form and detail as may be required, and approved in writing. During the entire work of construction authorized by this franchise an inspector may be appointed by the board of public works to see that all the terms and conditions of this franchise are strictly conformed to. All poles erected hereafter by virtue of this franchise and grant shall conform in length and the wires thereon shall conform in height to the reasonable rules and regulations adopted by said board of public works.

Provided, That nothing in this section contained shall be construed as prohibiting the Town of Newport or the council thereof from, at any time hereafter, exercising its police power to require the main line wires of the grantee to be placed in conduits in any other section of said town; provided, that such police power shall not be exercised except by ordinance, applicable alike to all telephone, telegraph and electric light wires and poles; and, provided further, that in the residence portion of said city all poles shall, so far as practicable, be set in alleys, where such alleys exist.

Sec. 3. That traps or manholes may be constructed along the line of said conduit for the purpose of affording access thereto; provided, that said traps or manholes be located or constructed in conformity with the instructions and to the satisfaction of the board of public works of said city; said traps or manholes shall be so capped or covered as to be flush with the surface of the street, and not to interfere in any way with the use of said streets for travel or traffic.

Sec. 4. The said grantee may, under the direction of the board of public works, or other such board or official of the Town of Newport as may be lawfully designated, make all necessary excavations in any of said streets, alleys or public places for the purpose of erecting and maintaining poles and other supports for its wires or conductors and for repairing the same, and for the purpose of laying, repairing and maintaining said underground pipes and conduits and said manholes, and for the placing, repairing, maintaining and operating said wires and conductors therein. All poles that are erected and maintained pursuant to the terms of this ordinance shall be erected at the edge of the sidewalks unless otherwise directed by the board of public works, or such other board or official as the council or law may designate, in a good and substantial manner. When any excavating shall have been made pursuant to the authority hereby granted, the grantee shall restore the portion of the street, alley or public highway excavated to the same good order and condition to which it was prior to said work, and all said work shall be done in compliance with the reasonable and necessary rules, regulations, ordinances or orders which may, during the continuance of this franchise, be adopted from time to time by the said council, or provided by law, and said work of repairing said streets, alleys and public highways shall be done to the satisfaction of the said common council, or such official or officials as the law may designate.

Sec. 5. Nothing in this ordinance shall be construed as in anywise to prevent the proper authorities of the said town from severing, grading, paving, planking, repairing, altering or doing any work that may be desirable on any of the streets, alleys or public highways of said town, but all such work shall be done, if possible, in such a manner as not to obstruct, injure or prevent the free use and operation of the said telephone and telegraph system of said grantee.

Sec. 6. The grantee, whenever or wherever electric currents are used or employed in or about the use of the franchise by this ordinance granted, or the ground connected therewith, shall provide and put in use such means and appliances as will control and effectually contain such currents in their proper channels on its own wires, so as to prevent injury to the property, pipes and other structures belonging to the town of Newport or any other person, firm or corporation within said town, and shall repair and renew said means and appliances, and from time to time change and improve the same as may be necessary to accomplish said purposes, all at its own charge or expense, and at its risk, selecting and adopting such means and appliances as shall prevent injury to the property, pipes or other structures belonging to the Town of Newport or any person, firm or corporation.

Sec. 7. For the purpose of effectually securing efficient service and for the purpose of continued maintenance of the property, plant, system and exchange constructed and operated under this franchise, the grantee shall keep and maintain its poles, conduits, plant, system and exchange in good order and repair, and shall render efficient service throughout the entire term of this grant. If the grantee shall fail at any time to keep in good repair the poles, conduits, wires, plant, system and exchange constructed, operated and maintained under this franchise, or shall fail during the period of this franchise to render efficient service, the council of said town may declare this grant and all the rights and privileges herein conferred forfeited, and upon adjudication of forfeiture by a court of competent jurisdiction, this franchise and all the rights and privileges conferred thereby shall become null and void, but no decree of forfeiture hereof shall be made if before the rendering of such decree adjudicating such forfeiture the said grantee shall place said plant, system, exchange and property in good order and repair, and shall render efficient service thereby and thereafter.

Sec. 8. Said grantee hereby agrees and covenants to indemnify and save harmless the Town of Newport against all damages, costs and expenses whatsoever to which the said town may be subjected in consequence of the acts or neglect of grantee, its agents or servants, in any manner arising from the rights and privileges granted herein.

Sec. 9. The rights, privileges and franchise hereby granted shall terminate at the expiration of fifteen (15) years from the date this ordinance shall become effective, and shall commence the day this ordinance becomes of force and effect.

That each and every street, alley or highway or any portion thereof, that may be disturbed or torn up by said grantee under the provisions of this ordinance shall be replaced and put in as good order and condition as the same was in before it was so disturbed or torn up, and be thereafter maintained for a period of one year.

That the grantee shall pay all damages, costs and expenses whatsoever to which the town may be subjected in consequence of the acts or neglects of grantee, its servants or agents, in any manner arising from the rights and privileges granted herein.

Sec. 10. That said grantee shall provide for the use of the Town of Newport space for two wires on the top arm of each and every pole erected, with the necessary connections thereto, all without compensation from said Town of Newport, during the life of this franchise. The said grantee shall provide one free telephone and connections for the Town of Newport.

That said franchise, as granted by the Town of Newport, shall not in any way be sold or transferred by the grantee, his agents or servants, prior to the actual completion and operation of same, and that this franchise shall so remain the property of said grantee as hereinbefore specified.

That said grantee will faithfully keep and perform each and every term and condition imposed by this ordinance.

Sec. 11. That any neglect, failure or refusal to comply with any of the conditions of this franchise or grant may thereupon effect a forfeiture hereof, and the said Town of Newport may, by its council with the approval of the mayor of said town, declare this grant and all the rights and privileges herein conferred forfeited, and upon adjudication of forfeiture by a court of competent jurisdiction, this franchise and all the privileges and rights conferred thereby shall become null and void.

That the rates for such telephone service shall not at any time exceed \$1.50 for a two-party line, \$2.25 for a single line, and \$1.00 for more than a two-party line, and that the number of subscribers on such lines shall not at any time exceed five.

Sec. 12. The said grantee shall, within thirty (30) days after this ordinance shall be passed and approved, file in the office of the town clerk of the town a written acceptance of this ordinance and franchise herein granted, and the failure upon the part of the grantee herein to file such written acceptance within the time herein specified shall be deemed an abandonment and rejection of the franchise, rights and privileges herein conferred, and this ordinance shall forever be null and void, and such acceptance by grantee shall be unqualified and shall be an acceptance of all the terms, conditions and restrictions contained in this ordinance.

That the grantee shall commence construction of said telegraph and telephone system, as hereinbefore specified, within sixty days from the acceptance of this ordinance, and shall have said system in full and complete operation within one year from the passage of said ordinance.

Sec. 13. This ordinance shall, upon being signed by the Mayor and attested by the Clerk before publication, take effect and be in force from and after its publication.
