Men As Well As Women Can Help Reduce Clothing Cost

Men as well as women can help reduce the high cost of clothing. A little care on the part of the wearer will do much to preserve clothing already on hand, and thus eliminate the necessity of spending large sums frequently to replenish the wardrobe. This is brought out in a recent publication of the United States Department of Agriculture, Farmers' Bulletin 1089, Selection and Care of Clothing.

Immediate attention to rips, sewing on loose buttons and hucks, reworking worn button-holes, and "preventive" darning are recommended as means of prolonging the life of a garment. The latter repair measure consists of reinforcing a worn place with rows of fine stitches or by laying a piece of cloth under it and darning it down with ravelings of the material. The heels and toes of stockings and socks especially may be treated this way before a hole is entirely worn through. Shortening sleeves or trousers a little to do away with a worn edge, or putting new cuffs and collar or new trimmings on a dress may often add months to the life of a garment.

The mucilage on the back of a postage stamp is made from the syrup of sweet potatoes. or married and not living with wife or husband on December 31, the exemption is only \$1,000.

Persons who reached majority during the year and whose earnings for that period amounted to \$1,000 or more, or \$2,000 or more, according to their marital status, must file a return and pay a tax on their net income in excess of those amounts.

To avoid penalty, the return must be in the hands of the Collector of Internal Revenue for the district in which the taxpayer lives, or has his principal place of business on or before midnight of March 15, 1921.

Harrington, the big mule man of Lathrop, Mo., has on hand 2800 head of mules which he bought at war prices and stands to lose \$400,000. So says Bower Bridgeford, the Kansas City Commission man who was here for the week end, says an item in the Paris Mercury. The mules are on the big Guyton & Harrington farm near Lathrop, and last summer Harrington fed them on oats bought directly from the thrasher at 75 cents a bushel. They are still eating their heads off—this in addition to the slump in mule prices, which is among the most radical declines resulting from the present depression. Still Guyton & Harrington, who bought mules and horses for the allies during the war, made big money, and will not be crippled like the little fellows. Bower says that present price in live stock will continue until readjustment is completed.

Income Tax Facts You Should Know.

Births, deaths, and marriages during the year 1920 affect materially income tax returns for that year.

Million of babies were added to family circles, each of whom brings an exemption of \$200 in the parents' income tax return.

Widows and widowers who lost their husbands or wives during the year are especially affected. They are single for the purposes of the income tax law and are granted only an exemption of \$1,000, unless the head of a family.

Persons who were divorced or separated by mutual agreement during the year also must consider themselves as single persons.

The status of the taxpayer on December 31, 1920, determines the amount of the exemptions. If on that day the taxpayer was married and living with wife or husband, claim may be made for the \$2,000 exemption. If single,
