EVERY WOMAN NEEDS AT LEAST \$40 A MONTH

Conference Decides She Can't Live Respectable on Any Less.

PORTLAND, Ore., July 25.—The first conference called in the United States under a compulsory minimum wage law has decided here that \$40 a month or \$9.25 a week is "the sum required to maintain in a frugal, but decent condition of living a self-supporting woman employed in a mercantile establishment in Portland."

IN WATER BUCKET

SANTA FE, Kas., July 25.—A lightning bolt first in a water bucket suspended near the bottom of a well Thursday probably saved the life of Lloyd Church, son of a rancher living in West Haskell county, near the Colorado line.
