

GOVERNOR HOLDS  
MAN IS INNOCENT

Issues Pardon for George W. Dillon, Sentenced From La-grange County for the Murder of His Wife.

INDIANAPOLIS, Oct. 8.—George W. Dillon, sentenced from La-grange county to the state penitentiary, for having caused the death of his wife, by poisoning, Tuesday was pardoned by Gov. Ralston. The state executive held that the man was convicted purely on circumstantial evidence and that evidence that would have tended to prove the defense's theory of suicide was not allowed to be introduced. The man was innocent, the governor held.

Mrs. Dillon died at her home in Mingo, La-grange county, from poison and an indictment charging her husband with murder in the first degree later was returned. In March, 1912, he was convicted of manslaughter and sentenced to serve two to 21 years in the state prison.

Gov. Ralston in freeing Dillon, who is 43 years old, points out that the prisoner always had borne a good reputation, never had been in previous trouble and that he is now ill from a malady from which his physician says he cannot recover because of his advanced age.

It also appeared that a druggist who sold poison to a mysterious woman about whom evidence was introduced at the trial was not allowed by the court to tell of his conversation with the woman. The court held that it was not proper cross examination.

The druggist later made affidavit that the woman had said, she was Mrs. George W. Dillon of Mingo and started the poison to kill her. The defense contended that Mrs. Dillon committed suicide but the court refused to allow the evidence which it was believed would have proved this. Dillon will be released at once.

TERRE HAUTE MAN IS  
ELECTED OUTER GUARD

Charles L. Pulliam Is Given Honor by Knights of Pythias Grand Lodge.

INDIANAPOLIS, Oct. 8.—Charles L. Pulliam of Paul Revere lodge, No. 374, Terre Haute, was elected outer guard of the Knights of Pythias grand lodge Tuesday on the third ballot, defeating John W. Grimes of Elwood, Eller E. Pryor of Martinsville and Thomas L. Neal of Lebanon. From outer guard Pulliam is entitled to progress to the chair of grand chancellor without further contests.

Heller, Columbia City, grand inner guard; William P. Hart, Huntington, and James E. Watson, Winchester, supreme representatives; John H. Frank, Alexandria, grand trustee.

A resolution introduced by Henry M. Poedimann, of Lawrenceburg, providing that a permanent relief fund be raised by assessing every member of the order \$1 every five years, was defeated after a short discussion.

Will Have Charge of Presbyterian Synodical Home Missions in Indiana.

PERU, Ind., Oct. 8.—The Rev. John P. Hale of Lafayette, formerly moderator, Tuesday was elected superintendent of the synodical home missions at the annual meeting of the Presbyterian synod of Indiana in session here. His salary will be \$3,000 and expenses annually.


