J. W. FITZ GIBBON DIES AT HIS HOME

Was a Resident of South Bend For Many Years and Was Widely Known in the Insurance Field.

John W. Fitzgibbon died Tuesday evening at 8 o'clock at his home at 938 Riverside drive after an illness of one year with cancer of the throat. He was 56 years old.

Mr. Fitzgibbon was one of the prominent insurance men of the middle west for years. He also practiced law as a member of the Montgomery county, Ind., bar. He practiced with Judge Dice of Crawfordsville for a time.

The deceased was one of the organizers of the Conservative Life Insurance company of Indiana and was its vice president and general manager. He was active in organization of other corporations.

Mr. Fitzgibbon was born Jan. 10, 1857, at Rochester, N. Y. His father, John Fitzgibbon, was at that time a captain in the United States regular army service and shortly after his son's birth moved to Alabama, where the deceased spent his boyhood days on his father's plantation.

The funeral services at the residence will be private. Public services will be conducted from St. James' Episcopal church by Arch-deacon Boynton Thursday afternoon.

Girl at Central School Building Has Autograph Copy of "A Child World."

ELKHART, Ind., Oct. 8.—In their celebration of Riley day, pupils of room 20 at the central building, were treated to a surprise Tuesday afternoon when a pupil, Isabelle Hardy, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Hardy, exhibited an autograph copy of Riley's volume, "A Child World," which was the treasured property of her grandmother, Mrs. Mary L. Hardy, deceased.

"For Mrs. Mary L. Hardy, the beloved Mary Loehr of this book—my mother's friend—with all grateful memories—James Whitcomb Riley, Indianapolis, Oct. 9, 1913."

Mary Loehr was Mrs. Hardy's maiden name and by which she was well known in Indianapolis during her childhood days. The Rileys and the Loehrs were neighbors, and the poet's mother and the Loehrs were very warm friends. In this way the author, then a boy, became acquainted with the girl to whom he paid the tribute in "A Child World."

Mrs. Hardy died at Adrian, Mich., Oct. 21, 1905, at the age of 68 years. For fifteen years prior to her death she had been an almost entirely helpless invalid, but in spite of the burden she was always cheerful and patient and bore her affliction with fortitude. Mrs. Hardy lived in Elkhart several years.
