

DEFENSE SCORES STRIKING POINT FOR MRS. EATON

Detective On Stand Admits He Found No Place Where Purchase of Poison Was Recorded.

TELLS MRS. EATON'S STORY ABOUT DEATH

Said She Awoke to Find Admiral Dead With Arms Clasped About Her Shoulder—She Nursed Him While Ill.

PLYMOUTH, Mass., Oct. 22.—Attorneys for Mrs. Jennie May Eaton, on trial for the murder of her husband, Rear Admiral Jos. G. Eaton, brought out a striking point Wednesday for their client. On cross-examination State Detective John H. Scott, a witness for the prosecution, they forced him to admit that, although he had made a thorough search of Boston, he had failed to discover any place where a purchase of poison by Mrs. Eaton had been recorded.

MASHED TO DEATH BY BIG ELEVATOR

Robert Campbell Instantly Killed When Pinned to Ceiling By Rising Hoist at International Harvester Works.

Caught between the elevator gate and the ceiling between the second and third floors at the International Harvester company building on S. Lafayette st., Robert Campbell, aged 25, of 216 E. Ohio st., was instantly killed Wednesday morning at 8 o'clock. The man's death was the result of his own carelessness and not the fault of any of the Harvester management, is the opinion of the coroner and witnesses of the tragedy.


TAKES AWAY \$80,000 LEAVES FOOTPRINT
