THREATEN MASSACRE IF INDIAN CASES GO ON

Fear Navajos Will Kill Government Officials on Reservation if Prosecution of Riot Cases Proceeds.

SANTA FE, N. M., Nov. 8.—An appeal for aid to prevent the massacre of the Indian agency force at Ship Rock, on the Navajo reservation in northwestern New Mexico, was received by United States Marshal A. H. Hudspeth today from Agent W. T. Shelton. A telegram from the agent says the Indians threaten to kill the whites at the agency on Monday unless the government drops prosecution of eleven Indian outlaws indicted by a federal grand jury on charges of riot and assault.

MAN GUILTY OF MURDERS

W. A. Borah Killed His Wife and Their Daughter.

ATOKA, Okla., Nov. 8.—W. A. Borah, a wealthy merchant, was found guilty Friday night of murdering his wife and their daughter and sentenced to life imprisonment. The bodies of the victims were found in the ruins of the Borah home after a fire on the night of Aug. 29 last. Borah escaped from the burning house in his night clothes.

OPERATORS' STRIKE FAILS TO MATERIALIZE

WASHINGTON, Nov. 8.—The inter-threatened strike of 200 telegraph operators employed by the Wheeling and Lake Erie railroad will not materialize. G. W. W. Hanscor, of Washington, assistant commissioner of mediation and conciliation announced here late today that after four days of conferences, representatives of the railroads and the telegraphers have agreed to arbitrate the demands recently submitted by the latter. The demands included a fifteen per cent wage increase.

NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR HATS OR COATS

NEW YORK, Nov. 8.—The appellate division of the supreme court Friday reversed the decisions of the lower courts which held that a restaurant proprietor is responsible for the loss of property belonging to a patron. The plaintiff, Reginald de M. Wenworth, obtained a judgment from the municipal court for \$40 against Leon C. Riggs, a restaurant keeper, because his overcoat had been stolen from a hook on the wall while he was eating dinner in the defendant's restaurant. The lower courts decided that the restaurant keeper had failed to take proper care of the plaintiff's property.

FIND BODY OF WOMAN

Had Shopping Bag Over Her Head—Police Investigating.

CLEVELAND, O., Nov. 8.—The a green cloth shopping bag drawn over her head and tied tightly under her chin, the body of Miss Margaret Preston of Valley Falls, was found floating in the Abbott run stream Friday. Miss Preston had left home about one hour before her body was found. The police immediately began a rigorous investigation. The woman was 35 years old.

ANOTHER VERSION OF GOLD AND ITS GLITTER

Cigarettes Seized by Custom Officials Prove to be Imitations of Horse Hair.

NEW YORK, Nov. 8.—Most of the plumage seized by customs inspectors here as cigarettes, which are prohibited from this country, proved to be imitations made of horse hair, customs officials announced late Friday after completing their appraisal of the confiscated ornaments. Originally considered by inspectors to be worth \$3,000 to \$4,000, the value of the so-called cigarettes has dwindled to \$400 and they probably will be returned to the women who were forced to surrender them.

WARNER PAID \$100 FOR POSTAGE ALONE

City Judge Elect Files Statement on Election Expenses—Cost Him \$375.75.

Herbert D. Warner, successful candidate for the office of city judge in the recent election, spent \$375.75 in his campaign, according to the statement he filed in the office of County Clerk Christoph Friday.

Warner's was the second statement to be filed, the first being that of John H. Clements, progressive candidate for councilman of the seventh ward, who made affidavit that he spent nothing in his campaign. Clements made this report on election day, determined to come within the time limit of the law. He is now under indictment in the circuit court for failure to file an account of his primary campaign expenses.

TREND IN JOURNALISM IS EXPLAINED BY ALLEN

Hugh Allen, managing editor of The News-Times addressed the students of journalism at Notre Dame university Friday. He spoke briefly of the methods of modern newspapers in printing news and advertising matter and how public opinion controls the policies of newspapers. Mr. Allen emphasized the main thing that honesty always pays, and, as time goes on, journalists are more generally beginning to realize this fact. In speaking of the newspaper of the future the editor predicted that the papers would lessen the importance of violence and crime in their sheets and that they would be more scholarly than the dailies of the past.

M'COMBS MAY TAKE PARIS JOB

Assented That Head of Democratic Committee Will Accept Position Offered by President.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 8.—Persons close to the white house said Friday night that William F. McCombs, chairman of the democratic national committee, who was married in London Friday to Miss Dorothy Williams, would accept Pres. Wilson's offer of the ambassadorship to France.

The post has been open to Mr. McCombs ever since the inauguration. He has twice declined it, but there is every expectation now that he will soon send the president word of his acceptance.

In political circles it was generally believed that Mr. McCombs would become ambassador to France and resign the chairman of the democratic national committee. Talk of a successor is already being heard and the name of Joseph P. Tumulty, secretary to the president, has been suggested by National committeemen in Washington. It was pointed out by some of those who are suggesting Mr. Tumulty that it would be essential in the choice of a national chairman to have some one who had the personal confidence of the president.

Mr. Tumulty himself declined to talk about the subject. As the democratic national chairman is not called upon usually for any extended work until the time arrives for the presidential campaign, acceptance of the post by Mr. Tumulty would not necessarily involve resigning his present position.

Succeeds Mitchell. WASHINGTON, Nov. 8.—Dudley Field Malone, third assistant secretary of state, has been practically selected by Pres. Wilson to succeed John Purroy Mitchell, elected mayor of New York city last Tuesday.


