NEWMAN TRAVELTALK.

The fifth and final traveltalk was given by E. M. Newman at the Oliver last evening before a large and well pleased audience. Never were more beautiful or more comprehensive pictures of Vienna, "The City Beautiful," shown. With its model Ringstrasse, its magnificent parks, playgrounds, promenades, cafes in the open, theaters, museums and art galleries.

Mr. Newman again proving an interesting traveler and lecturer, escorted his contented hearers through the principal drives, parks and thoroughfares, showed them the splendid buildings from points of advantage and gave them an intimate glimpse of the city and peasant life in Austria. Their theaters, art galleries and museums; the splendid universities, public buildings and churches were a revelation to many who had no idea such a thoroughly modern city existed on the blue Danube.

That the Viennese are a pleasure loving people was easily seen from their summer parks and playgrounds, as well as the bathing beaches were patronized. Their love and reverence for their ruler was indicated in many ways and the magnificent palaces of the royalty have few equals.

Mr. Newman was fortunate and evidently enjoyed in the taking of many of his pictures and his views are excellent. Particularly interesting were the horses and stables of the royalty.

That Vienna is a music-loving city and the home of its famous composers was indicated by the names in the central Friedhof where Mozart, Beethoven, Schubert, Strauss and many others lie in peace. Some of the greatest musicians of all time have left their impression upon this wonderful city.

An interesting side trip was taken by steamer down the Danube, where curious scenes and characters at a pleasant religious festival and fair afforded pleasing variety to the discourse.

It is with regret that South Bend bids Mr. Newman farewell for this season for his course has been of undoubted benefit and enjoyment. He will be welcomed back another season with renewed interest.

EVELYN THAW.

CHINESE IS HELD UNDER MANN ACT

Harry Toy of Seattle, Wash., is accused of Making a Slave of Minister's Daughter.

SEATTLE, Wash., Nov. 12.—Harry Toy, a wealthy Americanized Chinese, is under arrest on charges made by Special Agent William R. Bryon of the department of justice. He is accused of violating the Mann act in making a slave of Goldie Goddell, 18 years old, daughter of Rev. T. C. Goddell, a Portland, Ore., clergyman. Toy was arraigned before U. S. Commissioner W. B. Totten Tuesday and remanded in default of \$5,000 bail.

Toy, prominent in Chinese-American activities here for many years, created a sensation three years ago when he married Christie Goddell, a worker in a Portland mission. Soon after the marriage Toy's wife died and her sister, Goldie, grieving over Mrs. Toy's death, entered a convent. Government agents allege that Toy induced Goldie Goddell to leave the convent and come to Seattle to live with him. Soon afterward, it is alleged, he placed her in a resort.

Special Agent Bryon said he had evidence that Miss Goddell tried to escape but Toy caught her and brought her back, telling her that if she ever left him he would notify Chinese tons throughout the country and she would be sent back to him or killed.
