BIBLE THE BEST SOURCE OF WORDS

Slason Thompson of the Chicago Tribune Editorial Staff Relates Experiences to Journalistic Students.

Clever, pithy bits of sound advice to embryo journalists were carefully sprinkled through an interesting, reminiscent address entitled "Forty Years in Journalism," delivered Tuesday by Slason Thompson to the students of the school of Journalism of Notre Dame university. Mr. Thompson, who is an editorial writer for the "Chicago Tribune, termed his lecture "an autobiographical sketch of a journalist." In his address he reviewed the most striking features of his active newspaper career that began in the days when journalism was dominated by such celebrated figures as Horace Greeley, William Gordon Bennett and Henry Watterson, of whom Watterson, the famous editor of the Louisville Courier-Journal, is the only one still in the newspaper game.

TWO WATCHMEN ON GRAND TRUNK WANTED

Committee of Whole Approves Petition and Will Have an Ordinance Drafted. Two more watchmen on the Grand Trunk railroad probably will be ordered as a result of action taken by the committee of the whole at its meeting Tuesday night. In considering petitions for men at Carroll and St. Joseph sts., the board decided to approve the petition and the city attorney was instructed to draft the ordinance. The men are to be kept on the crossing from 6 o'clock in the morning till midnight.

GREW RICH WHILE NEW HAVEN LOST

Charged That More Than \$30,000,000 Went to Financiers by Sen. Norris, Who Wants Complete Probe.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 4.—Sen. Norris of Nebraska Tuesday introduced a resolution directing the interstate commerce commission to make a complete investigation of the New York, New Haven & Hartford railroad system. In an interview subsequent to the presentation of the resolution, Sen. Norris made these charges based on information which he said he believed could be substantiated by the interstate commerce commission: That more than \$30,000,000 of the money of the stockholders of the New Haven system have been diverted from its proper channels into the pockets of the financiers who have had control of the fiscal affairs of the road.
