PLANNED TO DYNAMITE HOMES OF OFFICIALS

Bert Dickens, a Carpenter, is Placed Under Bond of \$25,000 at Terre Haute.

TERRE HAUTE, Ind., March 11.—Bert Dickens, a carpenter, was arrested Tuesday afternoon and held under \$25,000 bond on a grand jury indictment for conspiracy to dynamite several residences on court officials engaged in the prosecution of Mayor Roberts and others, indicted for election frauds.

A woman whose name was not given out by Special Prosecutor Chalmers Hamill or Judge C. M. Fortune, went voluntarily before the grand jury, Judge Fortune says that before she did so she said she would testify that her husband was present when a threatening letter was written to Special Judge Felix Blankenbaker, the day following the shooting-up of his residence in the early morning, and that her husband was present when plans were made to dynamite the residences of Judge Fortune, Special Judge Blankenbaker, Special Prosecutor Joe Roach and Special Prosecutor Hamill.
