MOSS IS FOUND GUILTY BY JURY

Proprietor of Michigan Av. Pool Room Draws Fine of \$25 and Costs For Allowing Gambling Device in Place of Business.

Thomas Moss was found guilty and fined \$25 and costs by a special jury in police court late Tuesday afternoon. He was accused of operating gambling devices in his pool room on Michigan av. He expects to file an appeal in the circuit court. Charges of selling cigars to minors, of allowing minors in his pool room and allowing them to play, will be tried later in police court.

The trial lasted for 11 hours, beginning Monday afternoon, when three hours were taken in impaneling a jury. A slot machine alleged to have been taken at the Moss pool room was entered in evidence and William Happ, son of William Happ, chairman of the citizens' party last fall, and Charles D. Woolman testified that they played the machine.

As his defense Moss alleged that the machine was used by him, as a penny deposit bank and that it was kept under the counter and not used for gaming. He admitted that the boys were in his place of business and played pool, but said they did not play the card slot machine. They showed two checks alleging they were given to them as receipts when they won on the machine.

For an hour and a quarter attorneys argued the case. George A. Kurtz, attorney for the defendant, attacked the prosecution and declared that the charge was a "frame-up" on the part of police. The jurors were out 45 minutes and the case was heard before Special Judge Dan Pyle, who was appointed by Judge Warner on motion of the defendant. Deputy Prosecutor Nye represented the state.

STATE LAW IS UPHELD

Employers' Liability Act is Found Constitutional.

INDIANAPOLIS, March 11.—The supreme court Tuesday handed down a decision upholding the constitutionality of the Indiana employers' liability act of 1911.

The decision affirms a verdict of \$12,000 for Charles Stillwell, of Morgan county against the Vendavia railroad.

NEGRO WATCHMAN IS STONED TO DEATH BY MOB

Members Were Formerly Employed at Concrete Plant But Organized Union.

MITCHELL, Ind., March 11.—Harry Hart, colored watchman at the plant of the Lehigh Portland Cement company, was stoned to death, his son was stabbed in the shoulder and seriously wounded and a man named Perry Winkle suffered a broken jaw when 200 men attacked them Tuesday afternoon.

The men in the crowd were formerly employed at the cement plant, but were locked out following the organization of a union. During the last week they have been parading the street every day, but the outbreak Tuesday was the first trouble. Sheriff Sletter and some deputies arrived Tuesday afternoon and arrested 18 men. Preliminary hearings will be given them Wednesday.
