

Lady Baltimore Cake

The Most Popular Cake This Season. By Mrs. Janet McKenzie Hill, Editor of the Boston Cooking School Magazine. This is considered by many cooking authorities the finest cake that can be made, though in reality it is not at all difficult.

One cup butter; 2 cups granulated sugar; 1 cup milk; 1 teaspoonful rose water; 3/4 cup flour; 3 level teaspoonsful salt; 1/2 cup baking powder; whites of 6 eggs, beaten dry.

Frosting for Lady Baltimore Cake. Three cups granulated sugar; 1 cup boiling water; whites of 3 eggs; 1 cup chopped walnuts; 1 cup chopped nut-meats; 5 eggs out in thin slices.

Stir the sugar and water until the sugar is dissolved, then let boil without stirring until the syrup from a spoon will spin a long thread; pour upon the whites of the eggs, beaten dry, beating constantly meanwhile.

MAY 30 CONTINUES TO BE MEMORIAL DAY

Senate Defeats Measure to Make First Sunday of June a Holiday. INDIANAPOLIS, Feb. 4.—May 30 continues to be Memorial Day in Indiana. The senate Wednesday afternoon defeated the bill introduced by Sen. Reser of Lafayette, in behalf of the Spanish War veterans to change Memorial day to the first Sunday in June.

The house defeated the Bendel bill providing for the abolition of the board of public works in fourth class cities after much oratory had been spent on each side of the house.

Announcement was made that the democratic senators would hold a caucus Thursday afternoon for the purpose of considering what action should be taken on the proposed constitutional amendments.

FOUR CAUSES FOR EUROPEANS' WAR

Shepherd Leflier of High School Delivers Address at Meeting of Round Table—Affects Business in This Country.

Four great causes for the present European war were expressed in Prof. Shepherd Leflier's talk before the Round Table Wednesday night at the Oliver hotel.

Racial antagonism, the clash of commercial interests, militarism and the system of entangling alliances were emphasized in a lengthy paper as the primary sources of complaint by the various nations engaged.

Mr. Leflier said that certain countries preceding the present strife had demanded certain privileges without regard for the manner in which the privileges would affect countries in close proximity.

"One of the principal effects of the war upon the United States," said Mr. Leflier, "was the manner in which it affected our policy toward Mexico."
