WOOLEN CO. TO SPEND HALF MILLION ON IMPROVEMENTS

Mammoth New Office and Factory Buildings To Be Erected On Water Street Within the Present Year.

MEANS BRINGING TO CITY LIGHT WEIGHT RUBBERS PLANT

According to information given today by authoritative sources over one-half million dollars is to be expended within the next few months by the Mishawaka Woolen mills towards the enlargement of that plant. It is expected that by early summer a huge army of employees will be taken on by the factory. Improvements contemplated include a mammoth new manufacturing plant and a new office building. It is reported that so huge has grown the local company's business with the voluminous demands for its products, that the present facilities are inadequate to cope with it.

In addition to supplying additional storage room, shipping facilities and new offices, facilities will be had for the manufacture of a full line of light weight rubbers, which at present are being made by an outside factory. On the whole officials declare that it is the aim to make Mishawaka the home of all the woolen mill's products.

Considered Other Locations.

It is understood that the enlargement of the concern has been under contemplation for some time. Various localities were under consideration outside the city. However, after considerable study it was decided that local conditions were best suited for the new factories.

The main manufacturing building will be begun as soon as preliminaries can be arranged. A part of this building will occupy a portion of ground now occupied by the old "Rope" building on the north side of Water st., on which thoroughfare the frontage will be 100 feet and will extend back north across the race, and to the river line, making a mammoth building 400 feet long. The main part will be four stories; back

part two stories. From the north part of this building will extend an "L" to the west, 85x65 feet, three stories high. These buildings will be made fireproof throughout.

After this manufacturing building is completed and equipped, another building will be started on the vacant square east of the present large building, in which the offices are located.

To Cover Entire Block.

This new building will cover the entire block and will have six floors including basement, and the entire top floor, each floor is about an acre in area, will be equipped in the most modern way for housing the entire office force of over 200 people. This floor will be equipped with every modern convenience and device. The ceiling will be high and ventilating and heating, etc., as nearly ideal as they can be made. Spacious modern electric elevators will be installed.

A study will be made of various "welfare" needs and up-to-date provisions made which will include restaurant conveniences for all employees of the company.

1,000 Additional Employees.

It is expected that in new buildings and equipment, over half a million dollars will be expended in the contemplated improvements. A "hook" of 10,000 pairs of the new goods, daily, will be needed as soon as this production can be reached. This will require a thousand additional employees and room for growth beyond that number will be amply provided for.

Ultimately this means thousands of additional population for Mishawaka. The number of employees on the payroll of the company at present is 1,600.

KANSAS CITY SUIT DOESN'T STOP POWERS

BUFFALO, N. Y., Feb. 27.—Federal league magnates who are attending the meetings of the organization here refused to make any comments on the Kansas City injunction question stating that the legal action made it impossible.
