

I. W. W. LEADER IS KILLED IN UTAH

Roy J. Horton Shot to Death in Salt Lake City by Ex-Army Officer.

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, Nov. 1.—Resenting attacks on law and order and insults heaped on peace officers by a gang of Industrial Workers of the World, Maj. H. P. Myton, a prominent Utah politician and former United States army officer, shot and killed Roy J. Horton, I. W. W. leader, early Sunday.

Myton was arrested and is held on a charge of murder in the first degree, although habeas corpus proceedings have already been instituted to obtain his release.

The killing of Horton is the first tragedy to result from the demonstrations which have formed part of the propaganda instituted by the I. W. W. in behalf of Joseph Hillstrom, condemned murderer. Horton, himself an ex-convict, has been a leader of the local organization.

Fear More Outrages. It is feared the killing of Horton will precipitate the outrages threatened in letters received by state officials. It is known that some of the most desperate members of the I. W. W. have gathered in Salt Lake City.

Horton and a gang of his associates were standing on a street corner in the center of the business district when Myton passed by. Horton, who recognized Myton as a former jailer, made vicious remarks about officers of the law and said they should all be killed.

Myton went to his room nearby and, obtaining his gun, returned to the street. Horton was awaiting him.

Shoots Three Times. Pointing his finger at Myton, Horton said:

"Yes, I mean you, you— and struck Myton in the face, at the same time drawing his revolver. Myton, however, his hand on his revolver, fired three times in quick succession, and Horton fell to the pavement dead. Two bullets had pierced his lungs and one penetrated his heart. Horton's associates, who had witnessed the shooting, then fled, and police officers who reached the scene arrested Myton.

Myton is well known throughout the state, having figured in politics here for 20 years. Sunday some of the most prominent men in the city visited him in the city prison and volunteered their services.

The state, county and city officials are now taking every precaution to prevent demonstrations.

Blanche Walsh, Famous Actress, Dies in Cleveland

CLEVELAND, O., Nov. 1.—Blanche Walsh, the famous actress died at the Lakeside hospital at 8:20 o'clock Sunday evening, a martyr to her profession.

At the close of an engagement at the Hippodrome here two weeks ago Miss Walsh was operated on for appendicitis. Before she had entirely recovered she insisted on going to Youngstown to fulfill an engagement. She collapsed there and was brought back here a week ago. Since then she has been extremely low, but it was only Saturday night that hope for her recovery was abandoned.

Miss Walsh first became ill of a complication of ailments while playing in Toledo five weeks ago. She played a week in Pittsburgh under a physician's care and then came to the Hippodrome here, where she filed her engagement in "The Spoils of War." According to her husband, W. M. Travers, she suffered intensely and only finished the engagement so as not to disappoint her audiences.

At the final local performance she went to Lakeside hospital and was immediately operated upon. A week ago last Monday she insisted on the Youngstown trip. She succeeded in closing her engagement, but was in such a condition that she was brought here and placed again in Lakeside hospital.

The body will be taken to New York Monday.

Blanche Walsh was born in New York city January 4, 1873. Her father was the late Thomas Power Walsh, Tammany leader and one time warden of the Tombs prison. She graduated from public school No. 50 in 1888. The following year she began her stage career. Her first appearance was in an amateur production at the Windsor theater on the Bowery.

When 16, Miss Walsh made her professional debut with Thomas McDonough in "Siberia." She played with most of the prominent companies for the next several years. In 1892 she went under the management of the late Charles Frohman, appearing in "Aristocracy." Subsequently she was leading woman with Nat Goodwin, William Gillette and others. She succeeded Virginia Harned as Trilby in that play and scored a great success. In 1893 she toured Australia with Nat Goodwin, and on her return joined A. M. Palmer's stock company.

Succeeds Fanny Davenport. In 1899 she gave up her place as leading woman in a Denver, Colo., stock company to become leading woman with Melba McDowell, succeeding the famous Fanny Davenport. For several seasons Miss Walsh starred jointly with McDowell, severing the relations to become an individual star. She appeared in all the leading hits as "The Resurrection," "The Woman in the Case," "The Kreutzer Sonata," "The Straight Road" and "The Test."

In Feb., 1909, she suffered a physical breakdown and went abroad, returning until July. She broke down again in 1911. The following year she appeared in motion pictures and vaudeville and has continued in this line of endeavor until now.

Miss Walsh married W. M. Travers in 1906. There are no children. Her home is "The Lilacs," Great Neck, L. I.

SALES MANAGER KILLED

Goodrich Man Pinned Under Somersaulting Automobile.

AKRON, O., Nov. 1.—A. C. Huebner of Chicago, western sales manager of the B. F. Goodrich company of Akron, was killed, and E. J. Kroeger, former treasurer of Summit county, seriously injured Sunday when Huebner's automobile somersaulted down an embankment near Long Lake channel.

Huebner's neck was pinned beneath the car and he was suffocated before assistance arrived.

Kroeger was thrown clear of the wreckage.
