DENY BEAVERSON WAS EMPLOYED BY BOARD

President Nettleton of Safety Board Claims Vice Investigator is Fraud.

"All I know is what came up at the meeting the other night when Beaver's attorney presented a bill for wages. We never heard of him before and never saw the man. I don't know where he gets the dope, but the bill was turned over to Mayor Gaylor," was the reply of Pres't Nettleton of the board of public safety Friday night when questioned regarding the assertions of Edward F. Beaver, son of Judge Ford in the superior court Friday morning that the city of Mishawaka owed him money for services he rendered here as a special vice investigator.

Nettleton was then asked: "Then the board of safety didn't employ Beaver as a vice investigator?" "No! no! no! We don't know anything about him at all, excepting that he presented a bill the other night at the meeting. You had better see Gaylor, perhaps he can tell you more about him."

But the reporter found it impossible to locate Mayor Gaylor Friday night. However, Chief Krier was reached and replied to questions regarding the matter resulted: "No sir! he ain't. He ain't employed by any of us. They ain't nothin' to it." This was all the chief had to say about the matter and further information could not be secured, excepting that Beaver's attorney claimed the city owed him \$40 for his services.

FORMER MISHAWAKAN IN HEAVY DAMAGE SUIT

W. J. Oliver, grandson of William Oliver who some 30 years ago conducted a blacksmith shop at the corner of Main and Joseph sts., on the north side, and who was a brother of James Oliver, founder of the Chilled Pig works, South Bend, has had a breach of contract suit filed against him by the Manhattan Life Insurance Co., in which the company asks for a judgment of \$710,000. It is alleged that the former Mishawakan promised to sell to the insurance company \$700,000 of five per cent 20-year mortgage bonds of the Knoxville, Sevierville & Eastern railroad, and to receive in payment certain buildings in New York and Philadelphia. In return the insurance company was to lend Mr. Oliver \$350,000 at 5-1-2 per cent on the real estate. In an interview Mr. Oliver states that he has filed a counter claim in which he charges that the property offered him by the company in return for the \$700,000 railway bonds, was not in the physical condition represented in the negotiations. PASSPORTS WERE USED BY PAPER

Providence Journal Answers Charges That Story by Dr. Goricar is False.

PROVIDENCE, R. I., Nov. 13.—The Providence Journal Saturday morning said:

"In view of the declaration made yesterday by some unnamed individual for the Austro-Hungarian embassy in Washington that Dr. Goricar's accusations are false and absolutely baseless, the journal this morning begins the publication of a series of facts. They will prove beyond question the guilt of the Austro-Hungarian through the specific acts of Consul General Nuber and his office force of spies and tricksters.

"Geza De Berko, the editor of a Hungarian publication in New York, known as the Napszava, published at No. 178 Second st., in this city, was brought before the department of justice several weeks ago to answer to a charge of having allowed his passport to be used by one Capt. Pista Csizsar, an officer of the Austrian army, and for four years an employee of the Austro-Hungarian consul general at New York.

"Mr. Berko at that time told the authorities that Capt. Csizsar had stolen the passport from his home and used it on his voyage to Europe on Oct. 14, 1914, on the Italian steamship Stambolia.

"He stated furthermore that since Csizsar's arrival in Europe he had written to him apologizing for the theft. This letter which was demanded by the officials of the department of justice, Berko promised to search for. He has not yet found it. He told a representative of the Providence Journal last Friday that he was still searching for it, but that it had "naturally" been mislaid."

"The Austrian embassy and Consul General von Nuber were greatly concerned about Mr. Berko's inquisition by officers of the department of justice.

"Mr. Berko was telling the truth about the alleged theft of the Austrian embassy and Consul General von Nuber and his assistant in the office knew all about the theft. They knew when Csizsar sailed from this country that he was sailing under a fraudulent passport.

"The Journal prints this morning positive proof of this assertion by publishing in facsimile a postcard and a letter received at the Austro-Hungarian consulate in New York from Csizsar.

"The postcard is signed 'Berko,' having been written on ship from which Berko could use no other name. But the letter is signed by his real name. Both documents addressed personally in the same handwriting to Samuel Angyal, an official of the consulate.
