

WOMEN TO CARRY FIGHT TO CAPITAL

Will Make Strong Effort to Have Congress Pass Vote Amendment.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15.—All the big artillery the woman suffragists of the United States can unlimber is to be trained on congress when that body opens its next session on Dec. 6.

"We want to make suffrage the big idea of the opening of congress and drill into the minds of congressmen the votes-for-women propaganda until they can think of nothing else. We want to sweep congress off its feet for suffrage before it can turn its attention to anything else."

This statement was made today by Miss Alice Paul, the chairman of the executive committee of the congressional union for woman suffrage and if the plans which she and her associates have made mature properly, there will be a large enough suffrage demonstration in the national capital the opening week of congress to attract the attention of every member.

Never before have the woman suffragists been so confident of victory as this winter. They have practically abandoned all state campaigns and are concentrating all their forces to carry to victory through congress their famous Susan B. Anthony constitutional amendment, which provides for national woman suffrage. This, the leaders believe, is a short cut to woman suffrage which is in every superior to wearisome work in dragging single states into line, one at a time.

Delegates Cross Country.

The congressional union and the national American woman suffrage association, separate organizations with but a single thought, however, are joining their forces for the onslaught on congress. Mrs. Sara Bard Field of Portland, Ore., and Miss Frances Johnson of San Francisco, a sister-in-law of Rudolph Spreckels, the Golden Gate millionaire, are envoys of the women voters of the United States who have motored across the continent carrying a petition from the women voters asking congress to enfranchise the entire female population of the United States. They expect to arrive in Washington the day congress convenes or a few days prior and will take to the capitol their petition. This document was signed by a half million women voters at the San Francisco exposition and has accumulated about as many more on its way across the United States. The envoys are to be received by Pres't Wilson the day they arrive.
