For the Cookbook

ORANGES—THE YEAR-ROUND FRUIT.

ORANGE OMELET. 6 eggs. 2 tablespoonfuls powdered sugar. Sliced oranges for garnishing. Coconut.

When the main portion of luncheon or supper is rather scant and lacking in meat, an orange omelet will furnish a substantial and, at the same time, a dainty dessert.

Separate the eggs. Mix together the sugar, salt, arrowroot, yolk and orange-juice. Beat the yolk light and add this mixture to them.

Separate oranges into sections without breaking the membranes. Make a sirup of the water, sugar, apricot and lemon-juice, boiling it for five minutes.

ORANGE-DATE CAKE. 1/2 cupful butter. 1 cupful sugar. 2 eggs.

Usually when the family has tired of plain sliced oranges, they will welcome an orange dessert, and, whereas it seems a great deal of work to prepare "made desserts" for supper, it really does not take any more time than to plain-slice oranges and make an accompanying cake.
