NEW ORLEANS, La., Dec. 4.—Harry Stone of New York won the decision over Young Denny of New Orleans after 15 rounds.


SETS WORLD'S RECORD

sure a winner as the bone-crushing toe-hold made famous by Frank Gotch.

The same hold is counted on to give Stecher a chance for the world's championship if Gotch is coaxed out of retirement. Gotch has stated he will tackle this 22-year-old Gelliah and is expected to sign articles soon.

A match between these two mat artists will be the biggest sporting event of the winter.

Stecher won the American championship by defeating Charley Cutler with the leg hold, but after the match Cutler could not tell much about the hold. He said he simply couldn't remember how he felt. Hussane, the Turk, just beaten by

Stecher, was able to tell more.

"He got one leg across my back and the other across my ribs and locked his ankles," said the Turk. "Surely no other man has such strength. I felt as though I was getting a shock. I tried to get loose, but my muscles were no good. He got my wrist, stretched out my arm and my shoulders were on the mat."


