With Capt. Bacon, a South Bend boy, as center, the husky center of the visitors, in the starting roles, the Little Giants jumped into the lead right at the start of the battle and held it from then on to the end...

Notre Dame Fights Hard. The game was much harder fought than the score would indicate. The Notre Dame team struggled hard against its heavier opponents from the start of the game to its completion...

The largest crowd of the season watched the battle. Before the fray was well under way, Wabash had scored four baskets from the field. Notre Dame then came back with two and the rooters saw visions of a Hoosier victory...

The battle was rough at times, Notre Dame suffering most from penalties, and members of both teams fought hard throughout the battle.

The Wabash attack was built around Stonebreaker and his husky pair of supporting forwards, Capt. Bacon and Caldwell. These three giants were whirlwinds at their positions and were well supported by a speedy pair of forwards.

Stonebreaker and Bacon made some of the longest shots seen on the Notre Dame floor this year. For Notre Dame, King and Fitzgerald played most prominently. King put up a strong defensive game and Fitzgerald was active all through the contest...

The referee, a local man seemed to know little about the game other than register fouls against the visitors. O'Donnell, the leading captain of the invaders was a disappointment, he playing far from his usual game. Soulesley and Zilky played the best game witnessed in this vicinity in some time.
