

# PREPARES FOR HIS CROSS IN SOLITUDE

Rev. F. K. Dougherty Tells of Day of Silence by Christ.

With knowledge of His crucifixion near at hand, Jesus spent the Wednesday before His death in solitude and retirement, with no one to strengthen Him or help Him bear His burden, excepting His Father, according to the words of Rev. Frank K. Dougherty, pastor of Grace M. E. church, last night in his sermon on the subject "A Day of Silence." The actions of Jesus during the day and evening were told by Rev. Dougherty as follows: "His public work was done, while His enemies were completing their plans for His destruction. He would take a little time to gird up His soul for the trial of mockery and scourging, and for the crowning agony of the cross. He would need the repose of two quiet days to prepare Himself for the last sleepless night, and for the long torture of the last dreadful day, when He leaves the quiet village for the last time. On Thursday afternoon He goes to be betrayed and crucified. His whole body and soul and spirit will be tasked with the most exhausting and increasing intensity, until He bows His head in death at the ninth hour on Friday afternoon.

**Disciples Would Not Believe.**  
"Jesus had told His disciples and His friends at Bethany what would be the end, and how soon it would come. But they believed it not. He was going to the cross on Friday as if He were in prison, condemned to death, and the execution of the sentence had been set for that day. Yet we believe that He talked to those about Him, seriously and tenderly, yet not sympathizing, not even adding for their sympathy, but always striving to repress their hearts for the dark and terrible day when their dearest earthly hope would be crushed. He goes out, it may be, at night among the trees to be alone with His Father. He seems more than usual, perhaps, as if He were hearing the elements of some mighty conflict within, and they were harder to master than the storms of the sea. But there is no one with Him in His deep and awful conflict. He must go to His death with none to hold His hand or strengthen His heart."

## SCHOOL GIRLS BAKE BREAD FOR PRIZES

Lillian Lavara, Coquillard, Bakes Best Loaf in City and Wins \$2.

The old-fashioned art of bread-making for young girls has not entirely passed out of existence, judging by the quantities of bread entered in the annual bread contest of the city schools. Entries to the contest were confined to the 7-A eighth grade and the high school classes in domestic science. The classes have had bread making as a part of their classes during the year, and have practiced at home for the event.

Wednesday morning the judges visited the schools to inspect the most perfect and wholesome looking loaves, and those chosen for the final judging were taken to the grammar school. Mrs. K. C. DeRhodes, Mrs. H. W. Eldredge and Mrs. Fred Woodward acted as judges.

Prizes were won as follows: Miss Lillian Lavara, seventh grade Coquillard, received the prize of \$2.00 offered by a yeast company, for the best loaf in the city. She also won the \$1.00 prize for the best seventh grade school loaf; Lillian Wolf, River Park school, won second prize in the seventh grade, a small steak set, offered by the yeast company; Dorothy Davies won the \$2.00 prize given by John Byers for the best loaf in the grammar school; Ruby Redino, eighth grade Kaley school, won first prize of \$1.00 presented by Miss Bertha Adelsperger and also the steak set for best eighth grade loaf in the city; Eva Hathcox won second prize; Marjorie Rossell, seventh grade first prize of \$1.00; second prize went to Lillian Stricker and Lucinda Stringer took first prize in the 7-B grade at the Kaley school. A prize of \$1.00 put up by the mothers' department of the St. Joseph County W. C. T. U. was taken by Miss Mary Egan for the best loaf at the high school.
