

Benders Open Three Game Series at Springfield Today---Vets Take Final Game

JACK FROST BEATS BENDERS 3 TO 0

Two Hits Are All Smith's Boys Net Off Vets' Slabman—Sykes Gets Homer.

News-Times Special Service: DAYTON, May 27.—Jack Frost had the Benders eating out of his hands and two hits were all the Benders could get off the big slat. The Vets won, 3 to 0.

The Vets were in good shape to start something in the first, but wasted a double, single, pass and stolen base without scoring. With Nee out, Hobbs doubled to right; Spencer singled to center, and Hobbs got no further than third, as Grimes made a great try for the ball. Spencer, however, was out when he tried for second, when Tannehill got Bashang's throw to Koehler before Deertoot could reach the keystone sack. Loudermilk walked Storch purposely and then fanned Stewart, ending the inning.

Sykes Puts Vets in Lead. It was Earl Sykes who put the Vets in the lead in the second, when the big first baseman rode the ball over the right field fence for a home run. Lakoff, Jacobs and Frost, who followed Sykes, were easy outs.

Hobbs hit his second double to left with one gone in the third. Lee went to the far corner, while Koehler was retiring Spencer at first. Storch doubled to right center, scoring Hobbs, and Stewart skied to Fisher.

Frost pitched himself out of a tight place in the seventh. Bashang drew a pass; Grimes bunted and was safe at first, when Jacobs threw low to Sykes. Frost fanned Koehler and threw out Donnelly with runners on third and second. Frost slipped a third strike over on Fisher.

Hobbs' third hit was a smoking drive to right, that bounded by Grimes and went for a triple. Spencer almost took a hand off Zeizer with his stinger, which went for a single, scoring Hobbs. Storch forced Spencer at second. Storch died stealing. Stewart walked and also perished.

LAKOFF LEADING CENTRAL HURLERS

Herb Hill and M'Coll With Four Wins and One Defeat Top Benders.

Herb Hill is the leading hurler on the Bender squad according to figures including games played up to and on May 25, which has just been issued by Prest' Dickerson. McColl has the same average as Herb, but more runs were scored on him and he allowed more hits.

Hill worked in seven games and he is credited with winning four and losing one. He allowed 32 hits and nine runs, had four wild pitches, fanned 24 men and walked 17, while he hit three batsmen. McColl worked in six games, won four and lost one. He allowed 48 hits and 14 runs. He gave 12 bases on balls, fanned 12 men and had one wild pitch.

Lakoff is the leading hurler. The Dayton pitcher has worked in eight games and has won seven and lost one. He allowed only 50 hits and nine runs. He hit two batters, walked nine and fanned 18, and has not been guilty of a wild heave. Haggerty of Grand Rapids and Fromholtz of Evansville are tied with five wins and one defeat.

GAME IS CALLED OFF


Wisconsin and Northwestern Near Breaking Point.
