72 DEATHS FROM HEAT. CHICAGO, July 29.—A total of 72 deaths and 125 prostrations was the toll of the hot weather for the 24 hours, ending this morning, and the end is not yet.

Chicago Sweaters. In Chicago the maximum yesterday was 97, three degrees under the mark of Thursday, but there was little difference in the way it felt because of the excessive temperature of the night before.
