

FUEL INDUSTRY IN FULL CHARGE OF GOVERNMENT

Profits of Dealers are Limited by New Action and Prices are Expected to Drop.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 1.—Government control over the coal industry was made complete Sunday night by an order of Fuel Administrator Garfield limiting the profits of retail coal and coke dealers throughout the country to a basis which is expected to bring about an immediate reduction in prices to the consumer. The order, effective Monday, directs that the retailers shall fix their prices so as to limit their gross margins over cost to the average of such gross margins during the year 1915, plus a maximum of 30 percent of the 1915 margin, provided that in no case shall the average margin of the month of July, this year, be exceeded.

Another order revises upward the mine prices in certain bituminous districts in which unusual conditions exist, making the cost of production greater than in the principal bituminous fields. The new prices are for run of the mine coal in those districts. Brazil block in the Brazil block field of Indiana is fixed at \$2.95. It is the only Indiana coal listed in this order.

Will Watch Dealers. Local committees appointed by the federal fuel administrators in each state will see to it that the dealers comply with the order that limits their profits and the dealers themselves will be called upon to return sworn costs sheets showing the facts upon which they have based their prices.

WAR REVENUE BILL IS READY

Congress is Expected to Pass Huge Revenue Measure in a Few Days

WASHINGTON, Oct. 1.—Enactment into law this week of the great war tax bill, upon which conferees agreed Saturday night, is regarded as certain by leaders of both houses. The report will be presented to the house Monday and to the senate probably Tuesday and by Thursday at the latest, the bill should be ready for the president's signature. Opposition to certain sections of the bill is expected but the leaders are determined not to permit any amendments.

Some Increases Made. Another order Sunday night by the fuel administrator, makes changes on anthracite pea coal in the Pennsylvania field as follows: White ash, \$3.40 instead of \$3; red ash, \$3.50 instead of \$4.10; Lykens Valley, \$3.75 instead of \$4.35.

The orders also provide that Smithing and Cannell coal may be sold at prevailing market prices until further notice. The increases granted on the product of some bituminous fields, including the Brazil block, are to meet figures presented by mine owners, in many cases, showing that the prices previously fixed would not allow a margin of profit above the cost of production. An additional 20 to 45 cents a ton has been allowed in most cases, including the Alabama field, where mine owners protested that the government's prices would drive them out of business.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 1.—Plans for an international control of sugar prices and distribution were announced Saturday night by the food administration. The aim is to stabilize the trade through an international sugar committee, which will arrange for refiners' purchases in the West Indies and in the American insular possessions.

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SUSPENDS PROPOSAL

WASHINGTON, Oct. 1.—The interstate commerce commission today suspended until Jan. 25 next, the proposal of the Pennsylvania railroad to restrict the use of its Canton grain elevator at Baltimore to export trade only.
