Express Optimism. T. C. Cashen, new president of the Switchmen's Union of North America, also expressed optimism regarding the situation and said that his organization had taken no vote.

The union leaders, most of them chairmen of the four brotherhoods, probably will be in session several days. In addition to representatives of the engineers, firemen, conductors and trainmen, there will be those of the switchmen and clerks.

Reports from separate conferences will be made to a central assembly of the chief executives of the railway labor organizations. The central conference may then send back recommendations for further or different action.
