INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., July 30.—Victor Pinnell of Kokomo, serving a ninety day sentence at the state farm after being convicted of violation of the prohibition laws was granted a ten day parole by Gov. McCray today. The parole was granted, it was said, at the state farm, because of the illness of Pinnell's mother at Bayview, Mich.

Pinnell was charged with violating the liquor laws when he gave a party just before his wedding at Kokomo. He left immediately after his wedding for a trip abroad and was arrested upon his return to Kokomo.

## MISHAPS SERIOUS TO 2 AT LAPORTE

Young Men in Hospital Following Accidents—Recovery is Doubtful.

Special to The News-Times: LAPORTE, Ind., July 30.—Elli Dipert is in a very precarious condition at hospital today, as the result of being struck by an automobile driven by Howard C. Dunn, former county surveyor. When hit, Dipert was riding on his bicycle. Dipert became confused, it was said, and rode hankly into the path of the oncoming car. Dipert at first was entirely conscious and it was thought that he had suffered no injuries other than lacerations and bruises about the head and legs. But this morning a brain hemorrhage developed and the entire right side of his body is paralyzed. Recovery is doubtful.

David Goggen, 17 years old, whose home is in Chicago and a visitor at Fish Lake, sustained a fall today and was brought to the Laporte hospital where he is in a very serious condition suffering from a fractured skull. He is only partly conscious and recovery is doubtful.

## STATE SCHOOL BOARD TO AWARD SCHOLARSHIP

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., July 30.—The state board of public instruction has an unclaimed scholarship in the Colorado school of Mines, L. D. Hines superintendent, said today. He said the board would like to hear from any eligible person desiring the scholarship, which is awarded annually. The scholarship was awarded some time ago, but the receiver will be unable to attend the school, Mr. Hines said.

A. B. Tint and J. P. Reilly, of the Indian Refining company, are here from New York, in an effort to adjust the matter, it was said. They are making a study of the situation and will endeavor to bring about the establishment of a profit margin of two cents a gallon for dealers.

## URGE FEDERATION TO REOPEN CASE

Building Trades Department in Conference With Board at Indianapolis.

By Associated Press: INDIANAPOLIS, July 30.—Decision to recommend that the jurisdictional board of the American Federation of Labor set aside its previous findings regarding metal trim work and reopen the case for hearing in October was reached here today.

The decision was made following an all-day conference between representatives of the national board of jurisdictional awards and the building trades department of the American Federation of Labor, and the general executive board of the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America.

William L. Hutchison, president of the carpenters' organization, said the carpenters would again become parties to the jurisdictional board through reaffiliation with the building trades department of the federation of labor.

The action was taken by sub-committees of the building trades and the jurisdictional board and will require the ratification of the main bodies, Mr. Hutchison said. The carpenters agreed to the recommendations conditional with such approval, he added.

## BRITISH GIVE IN TO FRENCH VIEW

LONDON, July 30.—France has apparently won today in her contest with Great Britain to have the meeting of the inter-allied supreme council postponed from Aug. 4, the date originally set.

"It is becoming increasingly unlikely that the supreme council will meet next Thursday owing to the serious situation that has been created in Anglo-French relations by the French note of Wednesday and the British reply of Thursday," said the diplomatic correspondence of the Daily News.

## STATES CYCLOPS WAS SUB VICTIM

PHILADELPHIA, July 30.—The navy collector Cyclops which furnished the greatest mystery of the war by its unexplained disappearance, fell a prey to the torpedoes of German submarines operating off the South American coast, according to Franz Rottke, now second officer of the Hamburg-American liner, Deutscherfeld, who was former senior lieutenant of a U-boat during the war.

Rottke praised the convoy developed by Admiral Sims which he said made it almost impossible for U-boats to sink American transports. The only feasible method of attack was to divert the leading ship, a task few U-boats would care to attempt.
