"Everything About the House Helps to Make the Home"

DO YOU KNOW THE BEST OF THE AIDS IN HOUSE CLEANING.

Fashions in brushes, brooms, dusters and so on down the list of cleaning implements change but little, according to the ideas of the uninitiated. But the modern housekeeper knows they are constantly changing in form and material, and she looks them over once in a while to keep up with the times.

Among the brooms there is, besides the old reliable kind, the laced broom. The bristles are wired or laced in such a way that they may be removed in layers as they wear out and split. There is the heavy sidewalk or cellar broom which is overlaid with rattan, like a stable broom, and is heavily wired and laced. Then there is a new-comer, designed for matting, which is made of broom corn, and is shaped like a streetcleaner's brush.

For the long-handled dusters, which save sweeping, there are the long-handled, narrow brooms. These are made of fibre, as well as the ones having deep, soft bristles.

The upholstery brushes, pointed on one end and square on the other, are invaluable for cleaning tufted furniture. These brushes are aus-

mented by smaller ones, still more pointed in bristles, called mattress brushes. These take the fuzzy dust around the tufts after the vacuum cleaner has taken out all of the loose dust.

There are several shapes in stair brushes in almost any material—broccoin, fibre, wool, string and bristle.

There is a wide assortment of prepared cloths for polishing. Many persons make the mistake of adding oil to the already prepared dustless dusters and mops, which results in an oily, sticky mess. These prepared conveniences do not need anything added to them.

There are specially made broom covers of flannel, muslin and cotton cloth to slip over the bristles and tie. They are good for cleaning a plain wall but the broom is heavy and unwieldy. The soft lamb's wool brushes which come in three lengths of handles are the best for finely-shaped walls. Before using them the very long-handled cocks' feather duster will reach the moulding and plain wall but the broom is heavy and unwieldy.

A wash-tool, which is a pointed brush, will clean the window frame; and a chamois will clean the glass. Outside the wash-tool may be used where possible, and the so-called pope's head brush will do the clean-

ing if the windows are too high to reach with the chamois. Wash all china bric-a-brac in a wooden dish tub with warm, soapy ammonia water, and dry the pieces with cheesecloth. Brush the dust from carvings of all kinds with the sash-tool before washing or polishing, according to their needs. Brush carved gilt frames with the sash-tool, then wipe them with cheesecloth. Bronzes may be brushed, carefully wiped with a cloth which has been wrung out of cold water, then dried with cheesecloth.

Weighted oil or waxing mops are time-savers and do the work well. Gray paper cambric cleaning cloths are good to throw over the furniture while the cleaning is being done. The three-cornered long-handled scrubbing brushes are excellent for long halls and porches, when you must acquire the knack of managing them.

There are several varieties in toilet brushes, and the curved metal toilet tongs with their prepared paper accompaniment are popular. The enamel cleaning closet is a joy in the kitchen or upper hall in which to stow away all the cleaning utensils. There is a broom compartment at the right side, and shelves at the left for cleaning materials, small brushes, cloths, dusters, powders and polishes.
