KILLED PARENTS TO MARRY GIRL, YOUTH ASSERTS

Michigan Youth Admits He Murdered Two, and Burned Home.

SAGINAW, Mich., Nov. 18.—Richard Champlain, 22 year old veteran of the world war, pleaded guilty to a charge of murder when brought into court here today and was sentenced to life imprisonment in Jackson prison.

Champlain will be taken to Jackson late this afternoon. He confessed to the murder of his father and mother when confronted by his sweetheart, Clara Humpert, 19-year-old school teacher.

Champlain was accused as saying he shot and killed his father and stepmother Monday afternoon and set fire to the house that night to cover up the crime.

The father was not mentioned in the charges, owing to lack of supporting evidence.

Quarrelled Over Girl.

Champlain told the officers and Miss Humpert it was said that he shot his parents after a quarrel with them over the girl, to whom they objected because of religious differences.

Pres. Atty. Crane announced Champlain would be taken into circuit court Friday, where he had agreed to plead guilty.

Girl Brings Confession.

The confession, officers stated, was made voluntarily after Miss Humpert visited Champlain's cell and urged him to tell the truth. It was the first time Miss Humpert, a school teacher at Reese, Mich., had met him since the finding of his parents' bodies Monday night, and his subsequent arrest.

During the afternoon he had reiterated his claim to innocence when visited by Mrs. Francis Emmott, his sister, and the only other surviving member of his family.

The Original Complaint.

The complaints against young Champlain had charged that he killed his step-mother by striking her on the head with a hammer and then fired the home. No charge has been made against him in connection with the death of his father.

Son Was Only Heir.

According to county authorities, Adrian Champlain, whose farm was one of the most extensive in Saginaw county, recently disinherited a daughter, leaving the son as the only heir.

BOY BANDIT PUT TO FLIGHT BY PITCHFORK

INDIANAPOLIS, Nov. 18.—A youthful highwayman, armed with an old rusty revolver and wearing a black mask, was put to flight with a pitchfork Friday by Oliver Maines after the bandit had tried to hold up Maines and John A. Knight in the latter's coal office. Maines chased the youth several squares, but was unable to overtake him.

HOSPITAL CAMPAIGN COAL MINERS AID

Agree to Give Labor Required to Dig 1,000 Pounds of Coal in Drive.

PRINCETON, Ind., Nov. 13.—To aid the Methodist Episcopal hospital here in a campaign Friday and Saturday to make up its annual deficit, Princeton and Francisco coal miners have each agreed to give the labor required to dig 1,000 pounds of coal.

The Princeton coal mining company and the Ayrshire district company will give the coal. There are 200 miners here and about 200 at Francisco.

A large part of the operative cases at the hospital are the result of injuries to miners who are brought here from as far east as Muen and Winstow, in Pike county.

ADMITTS HE KILLED GUARD; GETS LIFE

Indiana Reformatory Inmate Changes Plea in New Albany Court.

NEW ALBANY, Ind., Nov. 18.—Changing his plea of guilty as charged, Clifton Knipp, an Indiana reformatory inmate on trial in the Floyd circuit court here for the killing of John Grimm, a reformatory guard, was sentenced Friday to serve a life term in the state prison at Michigan City by Judge John M. Paris.

The change of plea was made after attorneys for the state had proposed that Knipp accept a life term following a decision of the court to rule out a confession alleged to have been made by the prisoner before the Clark county grand jury at Jeffersonville, where the reformatory is located. The case was brought here on a change of venue from Clark county.

Grimm was slain last May in an attempt of prisoners to escape.


