

Killed Young Mother for \$50



CHICAGO, Nov. 26.—Thomas F. Catherwood will be placed on trial here charged with having committed the most brutal and most needless slaying since the Wanderer murder.

Asst. State's Atty. Harry B. Miller says Catherwood confessed to him that he killed his sister-in-law, Mrs. Beatrice Sharples, and her unborn child by choking her with a heavy rope.

Then Catherwood, says the alleged confession, made away with \$50 Mrs. Sharples had been saving for Christmas expense.

Allenists are studying these queer angles of the case:

Catherwood's only motive in the alleged crime was robbery—yet he was not in pressing need of money.

There was no enmity between Catherwood and his sister-in-law—she gave him food a few minutes before he is said to have slain her.

Allenists say Catherwood's sane. And he's intelligent, good looking and has a moderate education.

Wanderer recently was executed for killing his wife, who was about to bear a baby, and the ragged stranger whom he hired to stage a fake holdup.

TEACHER IS HELD IN AUTO 'RING' QUIZ

Scheme to Steal Motor Cars to Collect Insurance Is Charged.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., Nov. 27.—Miss Hazel Whitaker, a public school teacher here, was held in \$2,000 bail for a hearing by a United States commissioner Saturday in connection with an alleged scheme to steal automobiles to collect insurance. According to federal authorities, Miss Whitaker, a sister, and two brothers were indicted in Los Angeles, Calif., on Nov. 14 in connection with the case. Norman T. Whitaker, one of the brothers, widely known as a chess player and a lawyer in Washington, D. C., is under bail in the national capital, according to the federal authorities, and Roland Whitaker is under bail at Baltimore. The other sister under bonds, the federal authorities said, is Dorothy Whitaker. Another man, Harry Drexel, a former optician at Philadelphia, is said to be held in Los Angeles. Norman Whitaker characterized the arrests as ridiculous.

ONE OUT ON BAIL. BALTIMORE, Md., Nov. 27.—Roland Whitaker, mentioned in a Philadelphia dispatch as being concerned in an alleged scheme to steal automobiles and collect insurance, is out on bail here, awaiting action of the California authorities. indictment from Los Angeles. Both surrendered Nov. 14 when they learned that a warrant for their arrest had been issued. Whitaker denied knowledge of the car and claimed to be able to prove an alibi.


