## CHRISTMAS SEAL SALE VERY ACTIVE; BOY WINS CONTEST

### Eighth Grade Pupil Writes Clever Essay—Seals on Sale at Postoffice.

Mishawaka's Christmas seal campaign ends tomorrow. Mrs. William M. Probasco, chairman of the Mishawaka drive for these life saving seals, reports that the last responses have been much more generous than early reports indicated.

Seals are on sale at the post office and in all the local banks. Schools are cooperating and valuable help has been given to Mrs. Probasco by representatives of the various clubs and fraternal organizations.

Wine Essay Contest. Lloyd Webster, pupil in the Eighth grade of the Main school, won the essay contest conducted by Prof. H. A. Moran for the best essay on the Christmas Seal.

Young Webster's essay was under the caption of "What a Tuberculosis Christmas Seal is For" and follows:

"It gives me great pleasure to be with you tonight and to address you on this subject. I will tell you where we came from and how we looked. We came from the printing press and we were dressed in the same kind of a suit that I have on now. Don't you think it is a very pretty suit for one penny? I have many brothers and sisters that do the same kind of work that I do and we are all twins. You will find us always at your service at any time of the day.

"We never pout, frown or shirk when we are called upon to do our duty. We have a motto which we follow very closely and that is, 'To be on the spot at the right time, doing the right thing and above all doing it without being told.' The object of the large army to which I belong is to help tubercular people. If you would spend your nickels and pennies for us instead of shows and cheap fun you would be doing a deed that would really amount to something.

Must Go to Post Office. "I haven't much more time to talk because I am due at the post office in one half hour and I must not be late or I would not be living up to my motto.

"I will begin my duties as a common every day Christmas Seal. My closing words to you—won't you buy me or some of my companions to help the people who have to fight an uphill battle for their health and life?"

"From what I have heard, Mishawaka has gone over the top in everything that she has ever attempted, so won't you help to keep this grand record without a blot by buying some of us? I wish to say that I feel as though I were the proudest Tuberculosis Christmas Seal in this fine country because I am in a town that always finishes everything successfully that they ever began."


