PIONEER RESIDENT OF NAPPANEE DIES

Mrs. John Eshenbaugh Succumbs After Long Illness.—Other News.

(Special to The News-Times.) NAPPANEE, Ind., May 22.—Following a long illness, Mrs. John Eshenbaugh, a pioneer resident of this city, died Sunday morning at 10 o'clock at the advanced age of 71 years. Mr. and Mrs. Eshenbaugh moved to this city from Knox, Ind., 45 years ago, settling in this community which at that time was virgin forest. Their home now is on E. Main st. They were the early settlers at Nappanee and came here before the railroad had penetrated to this portion of Indiana.

Surviving besides her husband are seven children, Mrs. F. O. Peoples of Elkhart, Mrs. W. S. Hamilton of Mishawaka, Mrs. A. L. Byler of Warsaw, Mrs. F. A. Andrews of Nappanee, Mrs. Gilman Callender of Ellettsville, E. J. Eshenbaugh of Engadin, Mich., and Marvin J. Eshenbaugh of Laporte.

Funeral services will be held from the Methodist church Tuesday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. Rev. R. E. Detweiler officiating. Burial will follow in South Union cemetery.

Tipsy Youths "Rock Boat;" 25 Persons Nearly Drown

BRAZIL, Ind., May 22.—"Rocking the boat" of two youths who had consumed too much liquor was blamed Monday for the sinking in Eel river Sunday evening of a ferry on which 25 persons narrowly escaped death. The ferry was raised Monday and traffic resumed, and the four automobiles in which most of the passengers were seated when the craft sank were dragged from the river. Only the tops of the cars were above water when the boat settled. Children were hoisted to the tops and their shirts clung to the sides of the machines until boats arrived to take them off.

Jewish Fraternal Society Approves \$1,000,000 Home

INDIANAPOLIS, May 22.—Delegates attending the 20th annual convention of grand lodge No. 2, Independent Order of B'Nai B'Rith, a non-secret Jewish fraternal organization approved a campaign to raise \$1,000,000 for the erection of a new Jewish home at Cleveland, O. The proposition is to be taken before the meeting of the sixth district lodge, composed of Illinois and northwestern lake states. The districts, it was said, will co-operate in raising the money.

Huntington Baseball Player Is Discovered Dead in Bed

HUNTINGTON, Ind., May 22.—G. R. Hackett, 28 years old, pitcher in a local semi-professional baseball team, was found dead in his home here Monday. The body was found in the bathroom of the home and indications were that the man had been dead several hours. Hackett pitched a 12-inning game here Sunday and went to his home immediately following the contest. Officials are investigating the cause of the death with a view to determining if overwork during the game was responsible.

Grand Rapids Man Named Consul at Vladivostok

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich., May 22.—Atty. Rollin S. Winslow, of Grand Rapids, has received telegraphic notification from Secretary of State Hughes that he has been appointed vice-consul, "De Carriere," at Vladivostok. Winslow was formerly in the American consular service at Florence, Italy, following his honor winning service on the Italian front about a year ago he returned to Michigan, his native state, and took up his residence in Grand Rapids.

Young Man Dies While Surgeons Remove Tonsils

GOSHEN, Ind., May 22.—Glen C. Miller, 22, of Goshen, died today of heart failure at the office of Dr. A. S. Hollingsworth while undergoing an operation for removal of tonsils. One tonsil had been taken out and two surgeons started on the other when Miller expired.

3 NEW ELECTRIC FIRMS ORGANIZE

Upper Michigan Companies Formed During Last Few Days With Large Capital.

LANSING, Mich., May 22.—Three new electric companies have been organized within the past few days to serve hitherto unsupplied territories with light and power, two of them in the Upper Peninsula.

The Amasa Lighting Co. will locate at Amasa, in Iron county, which is the geographical center of the county. Cliff Electric Co. has been formed at Ishpeming by M. M. Duncan, O. D. McClure and J. I. Keeton. Ten thousand dollars has been paid in as capital. The company will distribute light and power in and around Ishpeming.

Mrs. Viva Nash said she found the body in an unoccupied outbuilding when she returned from a visit Sunday morning. After the discovery Dr. Herkimer attended her sister-in-law Bertha Nash, 18, telephone operator. Miss Nash is now in a delicate condition. No attempt has been made to obtain the girl's statement. She left her work at a telephone exchange here Friday.




