

### HEALTH BOARD IN DETERMINED PLAN FOR SANITATION

City Officials Pledge Cooperation to Eliminate Town of Disease.

The anti-fly crusade is on. War with a cudgel upon those violators of the city ordinances providing against rubbish accumulations, improper garbage containers and littering streets and alleys with refuse, has been declared by the Board of Public Health.

Through its secretary, Dr. C. S. Bosenbury, the Health department will insist that its campaign, while at the same time seeking the people's cooperation, will go farther than heretofore and demand arrests and prosecutions.

**Follows Meeting.**  
Outside toilets, outlawed from within the city limits where sewers are available after July 1, also come under the department's censure. Property owners who have not installed inside plumbing, as provided by ordinance, will after that date, be confronted with the alternative to provide such toilets or the city will order the work done and have the charges put upon the tax duplicate.

Bosenbury's broadcast followed the meeting of the boards of health and public works when questions of sanitation came up for discussion and definite action. After agreeing that the police would immeasurably assist in the campaign for a "cleaner

South Bend." Mayor Seebirt was asked to call a meeting in which the heads of the Health, Police, Fire and other departments, with the respective boards, be invited to attend.

**Cooperation Campaign.**  
The campaign was definitely launched with the announcement from the Health board secretary. He said:

"The Health department has found it necessary to seek out officials of the Public works department for a cooperative campaign to insure proper sanitation. This cooperative departmental work has to deal specifically with garbage and refuse disposal. While it is the Health department's prerogative to see that premises of property holders are kept clean, garbage collections are handled by the street commissioner. Refuse must be removed by the residents.


"It has been provided that garbage collectors be provided with notices which they are to serve upon property holders who neglect to provide themselves with the proper containers. Fruit boxes, tin cans and baskets are among the containers tabooed. The ordinance provides that a galvanized iron pail with a proper fitting top be used, one that is 'fly-tight.' This is the only sanitary way garbage can be handled.

"A drag upon the Health department's work is residents permitting the accumulation of rubbish, refuse, tin cans, old rubber and the like. In the case of tin cans, especially, flies find them a particularly good breeding place and at the same time they are germ producing.

**To Face Prosecution.**  
"Throwing of decayed fruit, garbage and other refuse upon streets or alleys is prohibited. Violators will be prosecuted."

In 1917, that by July 1, 1922, all outside toilets where sewerage is provided, must be removed. Dr. Bosenbury is emphatic that the department will take upon itself the necessary action against them wherever found upon the expiration of the time limit. If these nuisances are not removed by this date, declared the Health board secretary, the necessary inside toilets will be ordered by the city and the expense will become a lien upon the property.

### ILLINOIS MINERS FIRM ON STRIKE

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., May 25.—Illinois miners today refused to enter into separate negotiations with mine operators to end the coal strike. The state executive board turned down the maneuver of operators for separate negotiations, declaring they would not enter into a separate agreement until permitted by the international executive board.

Farrington emerged from the conference room and dictated a statement to newspapermen telling of the board's action. He said he would immediately notify the operators by letter of the refusal, which probably will spell "finis" to the operators' efforts for a wage conference.

The board also decided to serve notice on the Illinois coal operators that until the policy of the international union is changed, that Illinois miners "are not willing and are not going to meet them in a district wage scale conference."

The firm determination of the executive board to refuse the second offer of the operators to negotiate a state wage agreement indicates plainly that the Illinois miners are in the nation-wide strike to the "last ditch."






