

### MAROWSKY, 85, DIES OF LONG ILLNESS

Native of Germany, for 21 Years Resident Here, Succumbs of Complications.

Frederick Marowsky, a resident of South Bend for the last 21 years, died at his home, 1011 Sherman av., Saturday morning at 7:45 o'clock, following an illness of 10 months with a complication of diseases. He was born in Frankfurt, Germany, June 9, 1837, and was 85 years of age. He was married to Charlotte Egert, Sept. 23, 1862. He came with his wife to this country in 1882. Besides his wife he is survived by two sons, Frederick and Theo, and a daughter, Mrs. Emil Bozta. Twelve grandchildren and 11 great grandchildren also survive. Mr. and Mrs. Marowsky celebrated their golden wedding anniversary at their present address in 1912. Funeral services, which will be private, will be held Monday morning, July 3, at 10 o'clock, at the residence, 1011 Sherman av. The remains will be viewed at the residence Sunday afternoon and evening. Friends are requested to send no flowers.

### Rains in Kansas Cause Delay in Harvest, Said

Recent heavy rains have caused delay in wheat harvesting in Kansas, according to Detective James J. Cutting, returning to duty on the police force Saturday after a 15-day vacation trip to his brother's farm near Sedgewick, Kas. Rains and high wind have worked immeasurable harm to corn, especially on low fields, said Cutting. Its condition is very poor. Some fields have been plowed under. Softness of the soil has made cultivating difficult. Wheat condition of the biggest winter wheat state is poor also, the informant declared. "While the yield will run fairly large, the berries are badly shrunkened. This was caused by an early season drought and hot spell. The wheat generally throughout this area will run on a low average of quality."

### COST OF LIVING NOW CLIMBING IN FRANCE

PARIS, July 1.—(By I. N. S.)—Americans who come to Paris this summer with the idea that nine-cent francs—nearly half normal—will buy them a gay time for nothing will be sadly disillusioned. Figures quoted by Marcel Cachin, in "Humanite," communist organ, show that the cost of living in Paris, even for the Parisian who does not patronize tourist hotels, has increased three times since 1914. Wages have not kept pace with this increase, Cachin points out.

Cost of living has increased 600 times in Austria, 29 times in Germany, 22 times in Bulgaria, 462 times in Poland, twice in England, five times in Italy, four times in Belgium and 10 times in Finland, according to M. Cachin.

The most difficult interpreting task given Taylor came recently when he was called upon to translate the "finger talk" of a deaf-and-dumb Indian from the Ute sign language into English.
